



Tennessee Department of Human Services Fatherhood Initiative

The United States is currently experiencing a historic high in the number of children born to single parents, with 1 in 4 children, approximately 18.5 million, living without a biological, step, or adoptive father in their household (U.S. Census Bureau, 2022). This absence of fathers has led to significant negative consequences for families, communities, and society as a whole. Research indicates that children growing up without their fathers' active involvement encounter greater challenges across various aspects of life.

To tackle this issue, the Tennessee Department of Human Services (TDHS) aims to mobilize community partners, policymakers, and experts, to advocate for fatherhood and offer essential support to empower fathers. The TDHS Fatherhood grant program is a significant investment in the health and well-being of Tennessee society. The organizations listed have been awarded grants to advance the essential role of fathers in Tennessee. Grant recipients are on-the-ground service delivery providers with previous experience providing fatherhood or related programming to communities.

Services Provided:

Fatherhood Initiative agencies deliver a broad range of services to enhance father-child connections, such as:

- · Parenting and conflict resolution skills
- Financial coaching
- Educational and informational workshops
- Community events

- Mental health support and resources
- Networking and support groups
- Information and referral for additional services needed
