Dear Ms. Church,

The Department of Human Services (DHS) - Division of Audit Services staff conducted a limited desk review of the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) at First Step II Child Care Center (Sponsor), Application Agreement number 00-275, during the period of April 2, 2020 through June 17, 2020.

We requested information to complete the desk review on April 2, 2020. The sponsor responded on April 3, 2020 via email that they were currently closed and requested an extension until after Governor Lee's COVID-19 orders had been lifted for the State of Tennessee. We were completing the review to allow the Sponsor additional time to return requested documents and emailed the Sponsor with information pertaining to that request and the Sponsor stated they had reopened on April 27, 2020. Documentation was requested again on June 1, 2020 to review the claim for the month of March 2020. The sponsor provided the requested information and the review was conducted during the period of June 1, 2020 through June 16, 2020.

Due to the outbreak and the risk that COVID19 poses to the Sponsor and our staff, the review was limited to verification, based on review of the documents obtained from Sponsor, via e-mail or other electronic transmission of documents. We also obtained confirmation from the feeding sites and Sponsor staff via telephone or e-mail relative to the operation and administration of the CACFP.

The purpose of this review was to determine if the sponsor complied with USDA regulations set through the COVID-19 period, taking into consideration the waivers granted to the Sponsor's operation. Also, to determine if the sponsor complied with the applicable *Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations* (CFR) applicable parts, provider agreements, and applicable Federal and State regulations

Based on our review of the Sponsor's records and information provided, the Sponsor had two (2)

feeding sites operating during the review month. First Step II Childcare Center (Site 0001) was selected as the sample.

<u>Background</u>

CACFP Sponsors utilize meal count sheets to record the number of breakfast, lunch, supper, and supplement meals served. Meals served by participating Sponsors must meet the minimum guidelines set by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and DHS to be eligible for reimbursement. The CACFP Sponsor reports the number of meals served through the DHS Tennessee Information Payment System (TIPS) for reimbursement.

We inspected meal counts sheets for our test period and reconciled the meals claimed to the meals reported as served for each meal service. We also assessed compliance with civil rights requirements. Though requested, board minutes were not provided.

Our review of the Sponsor's records for March 2020 disclosed the following:

1. The Sponsor provided menus that did not meet the USDA meal pattern requirements

Condition

First Step (0001)- sample site

Based on our review of the menus provided by the Sponsor for March 2020, the menus provided did not meet the USDA meal pattern requirements. The menus provided had deficiencies as follows:

3/16/20	Chicken Patties, Peas, Mandarin Oranges, Whole Grain Roll, Pasta	Insufficient protein in chicken for 3-5 old children	22

Due to the new CACFP meal pattern requirements and emphasis on providing technical assistance during the implementation process, there were no meals disallowed.

<u>Criteria</u>

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.17(b)(4) states, "Each child care center participating in the Program shall claim only the meal types specified in its approved application in accordance with the meal pattern requirements specified in §226.20 ..."

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.20(c)(2) states, "Fluid milk, meat and meat alternatives, vegetable, fruits, and grains are required components in the lunch and supper meals"

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.14 (b) states, "In the event that the State agency finds that an institution which prepares its own meals is failing to meet the meal pattern requirements of 226.20, the State agency need not disallow payment or collect an overpayment arising out of such failure if the institution takes such other action as, in the opinion of the State agency, will have a corrective effect"

Recommendation

The Sponsor should ensure that menus meet the USDA meal pattern requirements.

2. The Sponsor provided menus that did not name specific components

Condition

Based on our review of the menus provided by the Sponsor for March 2020, the menu for breakfast served on March 9, 2020 did not identify the type of "Chex cereal" served to participants.

There were no meals disallowed because receipts and labels provided were sufficient to identify that Chex cereal was purchased to meet the meal pattern for breakfast.

Criteria

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.10(b)(4) states, "Each child care center participating in the Program shall claim only the meal types specified in its approved application in accordance with the meal pattern requirements specified in §226.20.... Menus and any other nutritional records required by the State agency shall be maintained to document compliance with such requirements."

The USDA Monitoring Handbook for State Agencies, page 24, states, "Daily records of menus must contain a listing of the food items served in each meal type to ensure that the CACFP meal pattern requirements were met..."

The USDA policy memorandum, <u>CACFP 17-2017 Documenting Meals in the Child and Adult Care Food Program</u>, states, "CACFP centers and day care homes are required to demonstrate that they are serving meals that meet the meal pattern requirements. Centers and day care homes must keep records of menus...."

Recommendation

The Sponsor should ensure menus reflect and meet the meal patterns established by the USDA.

Technical Assistance Provided

Technical assistance was provided via email regarding menus, particularly protein requirements and preparation for the Sponsor review.

Corrective Action

The Sponsor must complete the following actions within 30 days from the date of this report:

Prepare and submit a corrective action plan to address the deficiencies identified in this
