Dear Mr. Stallings,

The Department of Human Services (DHS) - Division of Audit Services staff conducted a limited desk review of the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) at Franklin Special School District (Sponsor), Application Agreement number 00-031, beginning on April 21, 2020. Our scope of the review was for February 2020.

Due to the outbreak and the risk that COVID-19 poses to the Sponsor and our staff, the review was limited to verification, based on review of the documents obtained from Sponsor, via e-mail, mail, or other electronic transmission of documents. We also, obtained confirmation from the feeding sites and Sponsor staff via telephone or e-mail relative to the operation and administration of the CACFP.

The purpose of this review was to determine if the Sponsor complied with USDA regulations set through the COVID-19 period, taking into consideration the waivers granted to the Sponsor's operation. Also, to determine if the Sponsor complied with the applicable *Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations* (CFR) applicable parts, provider agreements, and applicable Federal and State regulations.

Based on our review of the Sponsor's records and information provided, the Sponsor had eight (8) feeding sites operating during the review period. The FIS - MAC 1008, Gentry Foundation FIS 1030, and PGS – MAC 1007 sites were selected as the sample.

#### Background

CACFP Sponsors utilize meal count sheets to record the number of breakfast, lunch, supper, and supplement meals served. Meals served by participating Sponsors must meet the minimum guidelines set by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and DHS to be eligible for reimbursement. The CACFP Sponsor reports the number of meals served through the DHS Tennessee Information Payment System (TIPS) for reimbursement.

We inspected meal count sheets for our test period and reconciled the meals claimed to the meals reported as served for each meal service. We also reviewed documentation of the Sponsor's financial transactions including but not limited to purchases of food.

Our review of the Sponsor's documentation for February 2020 disclosed the following:

## 1. The Sponsor served meals outside of the approved serving time

#### Condition

During the entrance conference with the Sponsor on April 21, 2020, we requested attendance records, meal counts, and any supporting documentation to support the number of meals claimed for the sample sites. Our review of the meal count forms provided for supper meals claimed for reimbursement showed meals were served outside of the TIPS approved meals time at **FIS** - **MAC 1008** and **Gentry Foundation FIS 1030**. The approved meal times for suppers meals for both sites were 2:30 pm to 3:30 pm, Monday – Friday.

The meals count forms provided for **FIS - MAC 1008** reported meal starts times at 3:40 pm and 4:00 pm at **Gentry Foundation FIS 1030**.

#### Criteria

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.17(b)(9) states, "Each child care center must maintain daily records of time of service meal counts by type (breakfast, lunch, supper, and snacks) served to enrolled children, and to adults performing labor necessary to the food service."

#### Recommendation

The Sponsor should ensure that meals are served within the approved feeding times.

#### 2. The Sponsor did not complete monitoring of its feeding sites as required

#### Condition

During the entrance conference with the Sponsor on April 21, 2020, we requested monitoring documentation for the previous 12 months prior to the review period for the sample sites. The Sponsor provided documentation supporting that three monitoring visits had been completed for the sample sites in the last 12 months as required; however, there was no evidence that any of the visits made at FIS - MAC 1008, Gentry Foundation FIS 1030, and PGS - MAC 1007 had been unannounced.

#### Criteria

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.16(d)(4)(iii) states, "Sponsoring organizations must review each facility three times each year, except as described in paragraph (d)(4)(iv) of this section. In addition: (A) At least two of the three reviews must be unannounced; (B) At least one unannounced review must include observation of a meal service; (C) At least one review must be made during each new facility's first four weeks of Program operations; and (D) Not more than six months may elapse between reviews."

#### Recommendation

The Sponsor should ensure that at least two of the three required monitoring visits in a 12-month period are unannounced visits. The Sponsor provided menus that did not name the specific type of milk served

### 3. The Sponsor provided menus that did not name the specific type of milk served

#### Condition

During the entrance conference with the Sponsor on April 21, 2020, we requested menus, food receipts, and supporting documentation for the meals claimed for the review period for the sample sites. The Sponsor provided menus for supper meals claimed for reimbursement at **FIS - MAC 1008**, **Gentry Foundation FIS 1030**, and **PGS - MAC 1007** that did not name the specific type of milk served to participants.

There were no meals disallowed as receipts were used to provide sufficient evidence that the correct milk types were purchased and in sufficient quantity for all meals claimed.

#### Criteria

Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Section 226.17(b)(4) states, "Each child care center participating in the Program shall claim only the meal types specified in its approved application in accordance with the meal pattern requirements specified in §226.20.... Menus and any other nutritional records required by the State agency shall be maintained to document compliance with such requirements."

The USDA policy memorandum, <u>CACFP 17-2016 Nutrition Requirements for Fluid Milk and Fluid Milk Substitutions in the Child and Adult Care Food Program</u>, states, "In order to ensure compliance with the milk requirements outlined in 7 CFR 226.20(a)(1) and this memorandum, centers and day care homes must document the type of milk served on their menu. This includes listing the fat content (e.g. whole, low-fat or 1%, and fat-free or skim) and if the milk is flavored. It is the responsibility of the State agency or sponsor, as applicable, to further ensure that the correct type of milk is being served when conducting reviews."

The <u>USDA At-Risk Afterschool Meals Handbook</u>, page 45, states, "... starting October 1, 2017, centers must document the type of milk served on their menu."

#### Recommendation

The Sponsor should ensure menus reflect and meet the meal patterns established by the USDA.

#### **Technical Assistance Provided**

We provided the Sponsor technical assistance on May 8, 2020, regarding the updated "And

#### **Corrective Action**

The Sponsor must complete the following actions within 30 days from the date of this report:
