



- Average Hours per Week: 29.6 -Standard Full-Time Employment: 40 -VR Requirement: 15




Demographic Breakdown: Race

Demographics: Ethnicity







Demographic Breakdown: Gender



The department administers services for people of all ages living with mental liness, co-occurring disorders, or serious emotional disturbances. Services include housing, crisis services, suicide oresention, and over recovery.



The department plans, develops, administers, and evaluates a statewide system of prevention, treatment, and recovery support services for people at risk of or experiencing substance use disorder.





The department operates four Regional Merital Health Institutes in Nashville, Memphis, Chattanooga, and Bolivar and contracts for emergency psychiatric admissions at three private hospitals in East. Terrnessee.
