

Project Rural Recovery

Mobile health clinics to serve the behavioral and physical health needs of rural Tennesseans

Through an innovative partnership with community behavioral health providers, TDMHSAS seeks to address transportation and infrastructure barriers and get much needed services to rural areas of Tennessee. Project Rural Recovery uses mobile clinics to deliver integrated behavioral and physical health services in 20 rural Tennessee counties. At full capacity, the goal is to serve about 4,000 Tennesseans at about 9,600 clinic visits per year.

Physical Health

Chronic illness management, specialist care coordination, preventive health screenings, monitoring and management of diabetes, hypertension, cholesterol

Mental Health

Assessment, diagnosis, and treatment of mental illness and serious emotional disturbance, counseling services, medication management

Substance Use

Assessment, diagnosis & treatment of substance misuse disorders, medication assisted, treatment, nicotine cessation

Services provided at no cost to the patient. Patients of all ages accepted.
