Tennessee's Recovery Courts apply evidence-based programming and principles to help men and women find new lives in recovery

Mental Health Courts

The Mental Health Treatment Act of 2022 championed by House Speaker Cameron Sexton established \$5.5M in recurring funding to create new Mental Health Courts across Tennessee. As a result, Tennessee went from 3 mental health courts to 19 today with the ability to serve clients from 37 counties. These numbers continue to grow as new judges join the program and more courts are created.
