
## 2021 Tennessee Drug Overdose Deaths Report

The Tennessee Department of Health—Office of Informatics and Analytics released the 2021 Tennessee Drug Overdose Deaths report in November. These reports are useful to all stakeholders on the state, regional, and county levels.

East TN had the highest number of overdose deaths, encompassing 42% of the deaths in 2021, followed by Middle and West grand divisions. The "Unknown" category is not shown in the graph.

- Referred over 22,828 individuals to treatment and recovery support services.
- Started over **720** new recovery meetings.
