The Chair of the DHSMC-CAC shall have the proposed deaccession placed on the agenda for review by the members of the DHSMC at its next regularly scheduled meeting which shall constitute a public hearing whereby the DHSMC will approve or disapprove the proposed deaccession noting whether or not it is desirable to dispose of the recommended objects; what means of disposal shall be used; what minimum valuation, if any, shall be set as the price for which each object shall be disposed, or whether the other possible terms of disposal not involving price are satisfactory.
