- This is to ensure we comply with the Tennessee Governmental Entity Review Law & to prepare for our Sunset Hearing in Fall 2024
- At the November 2022 Sunset Hearing, the OAC was continued for 2 years of operation

Performance Audit - Update

 Since December 2023, the OAC Office responded to 7 requests (plus several clarification requests) for documents and clarification on processes

- Provided upwards of 45 documents to the auditor
 - These were reviewed and approved by both Sam and Deputy Commissioner Heather Gunderson prior to sending to the auditor
- Met with auditors 3 times to explain OAC processes



- OAC sought consultation with TDMHSAS, Attorney General's Office, Finance & Administration, Office of the Comptroller, and Central Procurement Office.
- OAC to use the TDMHSAS State grant contract template (with some changes)
- Community Grant contracts will be entered in the State of Tennessee Edison system
- OAC to use the TDMHSAS Budget, Contracts, and Monitoring System (BCMS) for contract and payment management. BCMS interfaces with Edison.

GRANT CONTRACT BETWEEN THE TENNESSEE OPIOID ABATEMENT COUNCIL, AND COANTEL MANE

This Grant Contract, by and between the State of Tennessee, Tennessee Oploid Abatement Council hereinafter referred to as the "Oploid Abatement Council" or "State" and Grantee Legal Entity Name, hereinafter referred to as the "Grantee," is for the provision of Scope of Service Caption, as further defined in the "SCOPE OF SERVICES."

Opioid Abatement Fund for the purposes of this Grant Contract means the designated repository of funds that are either dedicated to Opioid Abatement or Remediation or are otherwise directed to abatement or remediation and that are received by the state pursuant to a judgment on opioid-related claims, a recovery in bankruptcy on opioid-related claims, or a settlement of oxioid-related claims as specified under Tenn. Code Ann. § 9.4-1304
 - b. Opioid Abatement Council for the purposes of this Grant Contract means the council created pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 33.11.101 et see, and who is responsible for disbursing funds from the Opioid Abatement Fund for proceeds received from a statewide opioid settlement agreement with McKesson Corporation, Cardinal Health, Inc., AmerisourceBergic Corporation, Johnson & Johnson, Allergan Finance, LLC, CVS Health Corporation, Teva Pharmaceutical Industries Ltd., Walgreen Co., Walmart Inc., or K-WA-T Food Stores, Inc. or affiliates or subsidiaries of these entities that are deposited in the Opioid Abatement Fund, as outlined in Tenn. Code Ann. § 33-11-103(p). The Opioid Abatement Council operates as a state entity and is therefore an extension of the State of Tennessee.
 - c. Opioid Abatement and Remediation for the purposes of this Grant Contract means purposes that are specifically approved by the Opioid Abatement Council and include activities on the list of approved programs created by the Opioid Abatement Council, as specified under Tenn. Code Ann. § 33-11-103.9 and are specified on Attachment 3 of this Grant Contract.
 - d. Grantee's Application for purposes of this Grant Contract means the application submitted by the Grantee to the Opioid Abatement Council specifying the activities or services this Grantee seeks to perform in return for receiving funding from the Opioid Abatement Council

Community Grant Payments

Community Grant Payment Process

- Cost based reimbursement contracts with minimum quarterly invoicing (no more often than monthly)
- Invoices will be submitted to OAC office
 - Agency submits to OAC office
 - OAC office reviews and approves or contacts grantee with questions w/in 2 business days
 - TDMHSAS fiscal approves w/in 1 business day
 - F&A approves w/in 3 days
 - Payment goes out 1-2 days
- Request for pre-payment will be available in very limited circumstances and reviewed by Executive Director and OAC office to determine if appropriate



Community Grant Monitoring

Community Grant Monitoring Process

Contract language:

A.7. The Grantee shall be subject to programmatic and fiscal monitoring on an annual basis or as otherwise determined by the Opioid Abatement Council. The results of this monitoring shall be reported publicly to the Opioid Abatement Council during quarterly meetings and shall be discussed publicly by the Opioid Abatement Council during these quarterly meetings. The Grantee's compliance with their Application, Attachment 2 and the other measures of the Grant Contract shall be considered as part of the monitoring of the Grantee.



Community Grant Monitoring Plan

Still under development.....

Preliminary plan:

- OAC Monitoring Team
 - 2 Program Monitors and 2 Fiscal Monitors-(to be hired 8/1/24) will use TDMHSAS process as a guide and resource to perform both fiscal and programmatic monitoring
- Monitoring plan and schedule to be based on Risk Assessment of Grantees
- Monitoring will be combination of on-site visits, virtual visits, and desktop review
- Monitoring results will be reviewed with OAC during quarterly meetings


