



TENNESSEE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE

Application for Off-Highway Vehicle Temporary Operation Permit

PURPOSE: The Department of Revenue is authorized to issue and renew off-highway vehicle temporary operation permits in lieu of registration plates for Class I and Class II off-highway vehicles, as defined in Tenn. Code Ann. § 55-8-101, that are owned or leased by nonresidents. The cost of an off-highway vehicle temporary operation permit is \$6.00, plus any applicable county fees, as provided by Tenn. Code Ann. § 55-4-702. An off-highway vehicle temporary operation permit is valid for a period of 30 days, but may be renewed upon payment of an additional \$6.00 fee, plus any applicable county fees.

INSTRUCTIONS: Application for an off-highway vehicle temporary operation permit may be made in person through one of the county clerk office locations. The application must include this form, completed in its entirety, proof of, identification, and payment of applicable fees. Please note that Tennessee residents are not eligible to apply for temporary off-highway vehicle temporary operation permits, and that not all county clerk locations issue such permits.

DEFINITIONS:

"Class I off-highway vehicle" means a motorized vehicle with not less than four (4) nonhighway tires, nor more than six (6) nonhighway tires, whose top speed is greater than thirty-five miles per hour (35 mph), that is limited in total dry weight up to three thousand five hundred pounds (3,500 lbs.), that is eighty inches (80") or less in width measured from the outside of the tire rim to the outside of the tire rim, and that has a nonstraddle seating capable of holding at least two (2) but no more than four (4) passengers and a steering wheel. "Class I off-highway vehicle" includes mini-trucks.

"Class II off-highway vehicle" means any off-highway vehicle that is designed to be primarily used for recreational purposes, that has a non-straddle seating capable of holding at least two (2) but no more than four (4) passengers and a steering wheel, and that is commonly referred to as a sand buggy, dune buggy, rock crawler, or sand rail. "Class II off-highway vehicle" does not include a snowmobile or other vehicle designed to travel exclusively over snow or ice.
