Assistant Commissioner Fred Hix requested action on the following matter.

## Intermediate Care Facilities / MR Homes, Statewide

Mr. Hix presented a request for approval of a revision in scope on a project for **Intermediate Care Facilities / MR Homes** at areas statewide. He stated that the project currently only addresses housing for the medically fragile, and they would like to revise the scope to additionally include housing for individuals with behavioral difficulties. He said that these behavioral homes would be built to satisfy the housing needs at the locations where DIDD facilities are scheduled for closure.

Treasurer Lillard asked for more clarification regarding the revision in scope. Commissioner Hix stated that, as they start downsizing and addressing the closure of Cloverbottom Developmental Center, they have identified individuals who require a home that is different from the homes for which have historically been approved. He said that those four-bedroom homes are for the medically fragile and are approximately 4,000 sf., and these will be redesigned four bedroom homes with about 2,650 sf. for individuals who are behaviorally difficult in their level of care and need. Treasurer Lillard asked how many homes are involved and what was the relationship to the \$56 million project cost. Commissioner Hix responded that, at this time, it involves two homes as associated with the downsizing and closure of Cloverbottom. He said that the Department is committed to constructing 39 homes statewide, of which 17 have been constructed, eight are under construction, and others are in the process of being bid out. Treasurer Lillard asked if they will bring the disclosure of the location of these two homes back to the Commission, and was told that the property has yet to be procured. After further discussion, Treasurer Lillard confirmed that the procurement of the land for these homes would come back before the SBC. He added that, in the future, it would be helpful if staff would break out the cost of the scope change portion separately. The request was then approved as presented.

Commissioner Schofield presented a request for approval to cancel the previous SBC approval for utility grant negotiations with the Town of Spring City, and approval of a grant in the amount of \$7,200,000.00 to the City of Pikeville, for **Bledsoe County Correctional Complex** project at Pikeville, Tennessee.

The Commission acknowledged the attendance of officials from the Town of Spring City and City of Pikeville. The Mayor of the Town of Spring City, Mary Sue Garrison, was recognized. She stated that the Town of Spring City is ready and willing to be the State's water provider of choice for the new prison. She said that they believe that, while their proposal may be marginally more expensive to build and operate on an annual basis, it is still the better choice for Tennessee and the citizens affected by this decision. She said they contend that it is the better of the options because it will provide a more reliable water source for the prison, put into place a water source which will bring water diversification to the region and thus provide a foundation for long-range economic development, and can be constructed without additional delays.

Comptroller Wilson stated that this was a complex matter with a variety of different ramifications. He made a motion to refer the request to the Subcommittee, with authority to act. The motion was seconded, and passed without objection.
