Colonel Walker presented a request for approval of a project, acknowledgment of the source of funding and approval to issue a Request for Proposals for Design/Build Alternative Delivery Method for **Radio Tower Replacement** for the Department of Safety, statewide, and selection of a designer to assist in the development of the RFP and program and in administration of the project.

Colonel Walker stated that the Department was prepared to give a presentation of the critical radio communications upgrades as requested by the Commission at their previous meeting. He proceeded with a power point presentation outlining the problems and deficiencies of the aged, out-dated towers. Treasurer Lillard asked if these towers were being built for the public and local agencies' use as well, and was told "yes". Colonel Walker responded that there are no local municipal towers and most don't come close to meeting the need, and that inner operability is important. Comptroller Wilson commented that these towers are needed regardless of the new system, which Colonel Walker confirmed. Secretary Hargett asked for assurance that a maintenance schedule be lined up so that the same situation doesn't happen again. Colonel Walker responded that they would be following SEC guidelines and consulting with various expert groups to insure compliance. After discussion, the project was approved with the selection of a designer referred to the Subcommittee, with authority to act.

Commissioner Keys requested action on the following matter.

### EAST TENNESSEE VETERANS' CEMETERY, KNOXVILLE, TENNESSEE

Commissioner Keys presented a request for approval to allocate funding for **Expansion** of the East Tennessee Veterans' Cemetery, Knoxville, authorization to proceed with bidding the project with the understanding that Federal funds will replace State funds during FY 2011, and approval of the Early Design Phase as presented by McCarty-Holsaple-McCarty / Ross-Fowler, a joint venture. He recognized the designers who presented the Early Design Phase.

Commissioner Keys stated that a partial grant is available this fiscal year (\$2.4 million) and an additional Federal grant is anticipated in the Federal FY 2011 budget. In order to accommodate the projected schedule, it is imperative that the project be bid before July 2010 because the current East TN Cemetery is anticipated to run out of burial plots in March 2011. Commissioner Keys explained that, in order to meet this schedule, it is necessary to influx State funds until the additional Federal funds become available. When the Federal funds are in place, the State funds will be reversed out of the project, except for the cost associated with the Lakeshore effort.

The Commissioner then introduced Frank Salvas, Cemetery Grants Director with the USDVA, who was recognized by the Commission. Mr. Salvas complimented the State's staff on their involvement with the process. He said he was there to voice his support for this worthy project. He explained that his office fully funds each project that the Secretary approves. Normally, the VA doesn't commit to putting equipment into the buildings, but they have committed to Commissioner Keys that they would participate due to the importance of this project. He said he has to have documents in his office by July 15, 2010 in order for them to be approved by September 30, 2010. He said he was there to assure them that he was doing everything in his power in order to fully fund this project. He added that he cannot commit at this time to fully fund the project, but if they would approve the bridge funding, they should be able to approve the grant in August or September. He recommended that when the 2011 priority list comes out, the Tennessee project will either be #1 or #2, and they will identify the total amount of the project after July 1, 2010. Comptroller Wilson asked if the State of Tennessee was acting in compliance with all federal requirements. Mr. Salvas responded "yes", that the manner in which the Department was maintaining their cemeteries was commendable. After discussion, Commissioner Key's request was approved as presented.

### WEST TENNESSEE SOLAR FARM, HAYWOOD COUNTY, TENNESSEE

Dr. Simek presented a request for acknowledgment or approval of the agreements between the Department of Economic & Community Development (ECD) and the University of Tennessee, and between the University of Tennessee and the University of Tennessee Research Foundation (UTRF) concerning the management and development of the **West Tennessee Solar Farm Array** located in Haywood County, and approval to issue an RFP for design, procurement, installation, operation/maintenance support services and related Utility System Impact Study, and approval to issue an RFP for design and installation of transmission equipment and facilities to deliver power to the TVA grid.

He introduced Stacey Patterson who made a brief power point presentation. She stated that the first RFP is for services to design, install, and operate a photovoltaic power generating system at the West Tennessee Solar Farm in Haywood County. A system impact study to determine the optimal transmission path and equipment design for delivery of power through the Chickasaw Electric Cooperative's system to the TVA grid will be included in the scope of work to be provided by the successful proposer. After completion of the system impact study, a separate RFP will be issued for the design and installation of equipment and facilities necessary to deliver power to the TVA grid. She mentioned that a lease of the land to the UTRF by UT is needed and will be presented to the Executive Subcommittee to review and approve at the scheduled April 19 meeting. Treasurer Lillard stated that they have not reviewed the two RFPS's and would like to do so prior to issuance. The Commission acknowledged receipt of the grant agreements between ECD and UT, and between UT and UTRF. Comptroller Wilson asked that they have a copy of the underlying grant agreement between the federal government and ECD. The Commission then referred the matter of issuance of the RFP's to the Subcommittee, with authority to act.
