He added that the project would be finished by August 2003. Lieutenant Governor Wilder commented that it would be pretty, albeit, expensive grass.

#### SUB-COMMITTEE REPORT

Report received of action taken at the State Building Commission Executive Subcommittee 1) meeting held on May 19, 2003. Comptroller Morgan brought up an item from the floor regarding an approval of transfer of land interest in Hardeman County at that Subcommittee meeting. He said, under the lease agreement, it was contemplated that all or a portion of the leased premises would be conveyed to third parties for the purpose of an industrial park and any such conveyance would require payment to the State at fair market value based upon an independent appraisal. Comptroller Morgan stated that he wanted to make sure that the appraisals were conditioned upon establishment of fair market value on a basis which did not include any increase in value due to improvements in the form of streets, grading, access, utilities, or other development fostered by the Lessee and made to, or near, this property. 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Treasurer Adams asked Larry Kirk if anything had been worked out relative to signage lighting of the William R. Snodgrass Tennessee Tower. Mr. Kirk responded that nothing had officially been done. He stated that the lighting next to the glass wall was on a separate circuit and could be left on, but that the tinting of the glass affected the brightness and, therefore, would not have the same contrast and effect that the building used to have. He said it was Commissioner Davis' responsibilility as the Department of General Services operated the building. Commissioner Davis responded that there had been discussions about reimplementing the signage and issues of control and appropriateness had been raised. She said no decisions had been made yet. Treasurer Adams voiced his opinion that the previous use of the building for that purpose was a community asset and should be restored if at all possible. He suggested that they might set up a Board for control of the signage.

Treasurer Adams asked Mr. Kirk if the Administration had taken a position on funding a new State office building vs. buying one. Mr. Kirk stated that the Legislature had funded about \$35.5 million three years ago for this purpose and a decision had not been made at this point regarding building vs. purchasing an existing facility.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 10:50 a.m.
