In response to questions regarding the \$2.5 million increase, Chancellor Manning responded that it was to be used for kitchen equipment and furnishings to accommodate the vendor and that the vendor was responsible for payment of the debt service. STATE BUILDING COMMISSION

BY-LAWS, POLICY & PROCEDURES OF THE STATE BUILDING COMMISSION

1) Approved the following revisions to the *By-laws, Policy & Procedures of the State Building Commission,* as recommended by the Executive Subcommittee.

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5.01 REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL PROCUREMENT

A. Diversity Minority participation in projects

It is the express desire of the State Building Commission to include an emphasis on diversity in its contractual relationships with contractors for the construction, demolition or renovation of State projects under the jurisdiction of the Commission. The Commission acknowledges that firms who demonstrate and embrace diversity within their programs and policies are assisting the State in achieving its goals in building a more reflective marketplace of the community within this state. [SBC meeting minutes 3/10/94 and 1/8/04]

- 1. It is a policy of the State Building Commission that the above statement shall accompany the bidding or proposal documents for State projects under the jurisdiction of the Commission.
- 2. It is a requirement of all successful bidders or proposers on projects under the jurisdiction of the State Building Commission that they report to the State the names and amounts of contracts entered into with diversity minority-owned businesses on their contract with the State in order for the State to collect data on such participation.
- 3. For projects under the jurisdiction of the State Building Commission which utilize a procurement process for selection of a contractor which involves an evaluation of qualifications and experience as well as price, it is the intent of the Commission that such proposal evaluations will recognize the positive qualifications and experience of proposers utilizing minority, women, small and disabled businesses as well as a diverse workforce to meet service needs. In support of the above, it is the intent of the Commission to require proposers or bidders to submit in the qualification section of the procurement document:
 - A description of the Proposer's existing programs and procedures designed to encourage and foster commerce with business enterprises owned by minorities, women, persons with a disability and small business enterprises
 - A listing of the Proposer's current contracts with business enterprises owned by minorities, women, persons with a disability and small business enterprises
 - An estimate of the level of participation by business enterprises owned by minorities, women, persons with a disability and small business enterprises in a contract awarded to the Proposer pursuant to this RFP
 - The percent of the Proposer's current employees listed by gender, noting ethnicity and disability

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- a)—In support of the above it is the intent of the Commission to require proposors or bidders to submit in the qualification section of the procurement document a description of proposors existing programs and procedures encouraging diversity participation.
- b) In addition, proposers are to submit the following:
 - Listing of proposer's current contracts involving diversity participation
 - Estimated-dollar-amount and percentage of proposed diversity participation in the current procuroment
 - 3) Percent of proposer's current employees by ethnicity, sex and disability

REGION 4 – ELIZABETHTON, CARTER COUNTY, TENNESSEE

1) A request was brought up from the floor for approval to enter into a contract with HDR Engineering, Inc. to develop a conceptual plan and estimated cost for a cold water hatchery, including a section dedicated to rearing non-game fish species in need of management, and an aquatic educational center component. Representatives of TWRA, John Gregory and Nat Johnson, stated that the Fishpro Company, now HDR Engineering, had worked with TWRA in a review of their warm and cold water hatcheries in 2002 and had personnel familiar with hatchery functions and design. They added that concept plans will be used to solicit partners and grant dollars to be used to fund the final design and construction of the facility. The cost for the concept plan will be no more than \$5,000 and funded by TWRA license revenue funds. Speaker Williams stated that the property is located in Elizabethton, Tennessee, and that they have many ways of generating federal dollars. He added that most of the State's hatcheries are 40-50 years old and need to be refurbished. He said that this hatchery could make upper East Tennessee the trout capitol of the world. Treasurer Lillard then made a motion to approve the request, contingent upon funding being in the 2009/2010 budget. The motion was seconded, and passed without objection.
