MUSEUM FOR AFRICAN AMERICAN MUSIC, ART & CULTURE, NASHVILLE, TENNESSEE

1) Mr. Fitts informed the Commission that the SBC had approved a lease dated October 2004 of land at the northwest corner of the Bicentennial Mall to the African American History Foundation of Nashville, Inc. for the purpose of building a Museum for African American Music, Art & Culture on the site. He said the State retains the right of approval of the plans and specifications for the project, which was being presented to them for approval by architects, Harold Thompson and Kem Hinton.

Kevin Lavender, Chair of the Foundation, was recognized. Speaker Williams asked about the lease and was told it was a 30-year lease with a 30-year option and that Metro has committed \$10 million toward the project. Treasurer Lillard discussed the issue of local involvement with the project. Don Hardin responded that the design was done with input from neighborhood groups at public meetings. Representative Brenda Gilmore asked about the total cost and when construction would begin. Mr. Lavender responded that the total cost is estimated to be \$33 million and construction is scheduled to begin in May of 2010. He then thanked Representatives Gilmore and Pruitt and asked that the Commission continue to support the project. The Commission approved the Early Design Phase as presented.

Commissioner Matt Kisber requested action on the following matters.

SPECIAL ITEM

1) Commissioner Kisber presented a request for approval of the following grants between the Department of Economic & Community Development (ECD) and the following entities for the Volkswagen and Hemlock Semiconductor projects in accordance with SB0315 / HB0421 and SB0317 / HB0420. He distributed a spreadsheet indicating the State's funding commitments, a copy of which is attached.

Commissioner Goetz stated that the Legislative Bill appropriated funds to the Department of Finance and Administration for the purpose of making grants for industrial purposes and, as Commissioner of the Department of Finance and Administration, he was authorized to transfer amounts to the capital fund for use by the Department of ECD. He added that these funds are expended on a cost reimbursement basis. Commissioner Kisber mentioned that, on the site preparation work that has already been initiated, they did an advance of monies reimbursing for work done. Treasurer Lillard asked if this procedure was always used, and Commissioner Kisber replied that they used it on their fast track programs. Stephanie Tisdale, General Counsel for ECD, said they will include any standard language that is in the OCR grant contracts. She said there exists a Memorandum of Understanding, but they will have to do a State grant. Treasurer Lillard said that, if there was an issue with the Industrial Development Board, he assumed that the State would step in. Mr. Fitts responded that they will follow the standard grant contract language, but that language would probably not have a provision giving the State the option to step in and finish the project in the event of a default. Treasurer Lillard suggested they put that concept in the agreement due to the size of the project. He said he was going to vote on the assumption that something like that would be put in the agreement. A motion was made, properly seconded, and passed without objection to approve Commissioner Kisber's request as presented.
