NEW PRISON, MORGAN COUNTY, TENNESSEE

1) Commissioner White presented a request for approval to perform site evaluations and pre-plan a project for a New Prison to be located in Morgan County, and selection of a designer to plan the project. He stated that the planning cost could include site analysis between two potential sites at Morgan County Regional Facility, preliminary design, environmental analysis, security consulting services, surveying, and infrastructure design. He said he would also like to request approval of commissioning services for the project.

Speaker Naifeh asked how many beds were planned. Commissioner White stated that they planned for 1428 beds, but with the closing of Brushy, they would net 838 beds. The Speaker questioned the cost from seven years ago from \$40 million to \$102 million and asked what was planned for the old Brushy facility. Commissioner White responded that it had not been determined, but there were several options, such as interest by movie companies for filming. He said the upkeep was too costly from the Department's perspective. Speaker Naifeh asked why they were not building a prison with 2200 beds if that many are needed. Treasurer Adams stated that the SBC commissioned the master planning and asked if it had been forwarded to the SBC for he thought they needed to look at it. He added that this was the first time they have seen these cost figures, and it would be good to see that study. He said that, conceptually, they needed to see that study to get a better understanding. He added that he thought going forward at Brushy was an excellent plan and the State was going to save money over the long run. Commissioner White mentioned that time was of the essence, but that they were willing to do whatever was asked by the Commission. He said he would forward the plan to the Commission immediately. Treasurer Adams said they wanted to move forward today but they may want to revisit some aspects of the project after reviewing the study.

Senator Kilby was recognized. He said he wanted to thank the Commission for taking this matter up so quickly after going to Oversight. He also wanted to thank the governor for making the decision move so quickly, and commended the SBC for looking after the dollars. The Commission approved the request as presented with the selection of a designer referred to the Subcommittee, with authority to act.
