

## **Educator Preparation Report Card**

The State Board is required by statute (T.C.A. § 49-1-302) to produce an annual report card on educator preparation providers (EPPs), which is updated each February 15 with current data. Previously produced by the Tennessee Higher Education Commission, the State Board redesigned the report card in 2016 to become a user-friendly web-based tool. The report card's goal is to spotlight programs that are achieving success on indicators important to the State: recruiting a strong, diverse candidate pool, preparing candidates in high-need endorsement areas in Tennessee public schools, and ensuring new teachers are ready to make a positive impact on their students' achievement.

Each year, the State Board seeks feedback through an Advisory Council with representatives from EPPs and other stakeholder groups. The 2018 report card, which will be issued on Feb. 15, 2019, will feature several enhancements based on the Advisory Council's recommendations. The State Board also plans for a more substantial upgrade to the website design for the 2019 report card to further increase ease-of-use for candidates who are less familiar with education terminology and data; for example, high school students or professionals in other fields interested in becoming teachers.
