PROFESSIONAL ASSESSMENTS FOR TENNESSEE EDUCATORS

5.105

Individuals applying for an initial educator license in Tennessee shall submit passing scores on an assessment that measures professional knowledge and is correlated to Tennessee’s professional education standards. This requirement does not apply to school counselors, school psychologists, school social workers, educational interpreters, or speech/language teachers. These timelines and expectations for submitting qualifying scores are detailed in Appendix C of the Educator Licensure Policy (5.502).

Required assessments, assessment codes, and qualifying scores are found in the tables below. Qualifying scores on assessments that have been regenerated or replaced will be accepted no more than five (5) years after the date when the assessment was taken.

Educator preparation programs may admit candidates who present qualifying scores on the following assessments, in addition to other required admissions criteria.

Pedagogical and content knowledge assessments are required for all licensure candidates.

Beginning January 1, 2019, individuals applying for an initial educator license shall submit qualifying scores on the appropriate edTPA performance-based, subject-specific assessment. Prior to January 1, 2019, individuals applying for licensure must submit a qualifying score on either the relevant Principles of Learning and Teaching or edTPA assessment. Individuals completing job-embedded clinical practice shall submit the qualifying score before renewing or advancing the teaching license.

- (1) Prior to Jan. 1, 2019, individuals seeking licensure and endorsement in Early Childhood Education pre-K-3 or Special Education Preschool/Early Childhood pre-K-3, who are not completing the relevant edTPA, are encouraged to take the Principles of Learning and Teaching (PLT): Early Childhood or PLT: Grades K-6 assessment.

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- (2) Prior to Jan. 1, 2019, individuals seeking licensure and endorsement in Elementary Education K-5, who are not completing the relevant edTPA, are encouraged to take PLT: Grades K-5. Individuals seeking licensure in one (1) of the middle grades (6-8/4-8) endorsement areas are encouraged to take PLT: Grades 5-9.
- (3) Prior to Jan. 1, 2019, individuals seeking licensure in secondary education areas, who are not completing the relevant edTPA, are encouraged to take PLT: Grades 7-12. Individuals seeking licensure and endorsement in K-12 or pre-K-12 areas may choose from PLT: Early Childhood, PLT: Grades K-6, PLT: Grades 5-9, or PLT: Grades 7-12.
- (4) Prior to Jan. 1, 2019, individuals seeking licensure renewal or advancement in occupational areas are required to submit qualifying scores on the PLT: Grades 7-12.
- (5) Individuals seeking licensure as a School Counselor, School Psychologist, or Speech/Language Pathologist are required to take only the content knowledge assessment for the endorsement (PLT assessment is not required for these endorsements).

Specialty Area Tests

Individuals seeking licensure in Tennessee shall also submit qualifying scores on the relevant specialty area content knowledge assessment(s) for all endorsements for which the applicant is seeking licensure.
