Alternative Pathways for High School Equivalency

What is a High School Equivalency (HSE) Diploma?

- Official TN secondary school credential
- Allows entry into postsecondary, training, jobs, promotions, higher wages
- ~430,000 working-age Tennesseans without HS diploma or equivalent
- TDLWD oversees HSE preparation programs and diplomas
- Currently, HiSET exam is only option



Lois M. DeBerry Alternative Diploma Act

- TCA 4-3-1422. Lois M. DeBerry Alternative Diploma Act -- Assessments that lead to high school equivalency credential.
- (b) The department of labor and workforce development is authorized to make recommendations relative to assessments that lead to the award of a high school equivalency credential. The state board shall review the recommendations of the department. Any recommendation approved by the state board of education shall be considered a high school equivalency assessment and the successful completion of such assessment shall lead to the award of a high school equivalency credential. The department, as needed, may consult with or request assistance from other state agencies in performing its duties under this section.

How is Current Diploma Pathway a Problem?

- Only option currently approved for diploma is HiSET exam
 - 5-subject, multiple-choice (plus a written essay), time-limited, standardized test, just like the GED
- Students are eager to have other options
- Other states have created alternative pathways
- Alternative pathways can expedite the journey to postsecondary and career opportunities



Proposed New Assessments

- Tests of Adult Basic Education (TABE)
 - Math, Reading, Language (Writing)
- Comprehensive Adult Student Assessment Systems (CASAS)
 - Math, Reading
- ACT WorkKeys
 - Match, Reading
- All are approved by the U.S. Department of Education as tests suitable for determining measurable skill growth in adult education students
- Passing scores correlate to passing scores on HiSET and GED
