# Academic and Instructional Requirements - Promotion and Retention Rule 0520-01-03-.16

### The Background:

The State Board's Promotion and Retention Rule 0520-01-03-.16 outlines promotion and retention requirements for K-8 students. The rule also details pathways to 4th grade promotion for 3rd grade students who score "approaching" or "below" on the ELA portion of the TCAP, in accordance with T.C.A. § 49-6-3115.

This item revises the rule to align with two pieces of legislation passed in the 2024 legislative session:

- 1. Chapter 829 of the Public Acts of 2024 (PC 829) authorizes a parent or guardian of a student enrolled in kindergarten through second grade (K-2) to elect to retain the student in the student's current grade level if the student has a "documented academic or behavioral delay" and the parent or guardian believes that retention may benefit the student. PC 829 requires the State Board of Education to promulgate rules to define a "documented academic or behavioral delay."
  - a. The Rule defines a "documented academic delay" as a student who is receiving Tier III academic interventions through the Response to Instruction and Intervention Framework and who currently has a student intervention plan in the area of math or reading or an individualized learning plan for characteristics of dyslexia (ILP-D).
  - b. The Rule defines a "documented behavioral delay" as a student who is receiving Tier III behavioral interventions through the Response to Instruction and Intervention Framework and who currently has a student intervention plan for behavior.
- 2. Chapter 989 of the Public Acts of 2023 (PC 989) amended T.C.A. § 49-6-3115 to include a conference pathway for students who do not demonstrate adequate growth on the 4<sup>th</sup> grade ELA TCAP. Beginning with students in 4<sup>th</sup> grade in the 2023-24 school year, a conference may be convened for 4<sup>th</sup> grade students who are required to show adequate growth on the 4<sup>th</sup> grade ELA TCAP to be promoted to the 5<sup>th</sup> grade, but do not demonstrate growth. PC 989 requires that the conference include the following categories of participants: the student's principal, ELA teacher and parent or legal guardian. A majority of the categories of participants required to be present in the conference are required to make a recommendation to promote the student to 5<sup>th</sup> grade with tutoring supports or retain the student in 4<sup>th</sup> grade. This item updates the Rule to align with PC 989.

State Board staff will hold a rulemaking hearing between first and final reading to collect public feedback.

#### The Fiscal Analysis Impact:

T.C.A. § 49-1-212 requires that the Department prepare a fiscal analysis of any policy, rule, or regulation proposed to the State Board of Education. This item has no financial impact on an LEA beyond any required by law.

## **Connection to the Master Plan:**

This item supports the State Board's strategic focus on Literacy outlined in the Master Plan by ensuring students receive additional learning supports as part of their promotion to 5<sup>th</sup> grade and by ensuring its rules are reviewed and updated based on changes in law.

#### The Recommendation:

The Department of Education recommends acceptance of this item on first reading. The SBE staff concurs with this recommendation.
