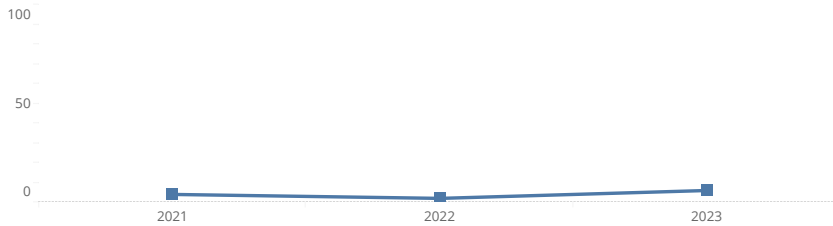
Based upon Milligan University's mission to honor God by educating men and women to be servant leaders, the Doctor of Education (Ed.D.) program specifically endeavors to prepare caring and reflecting professionals who integrate their Christian faith, social responsibility, and sound scholarship to contribute to a responsible and caring community.

The Doctor of Education (Ed.D.) program leads to certification as a school administrator in a 57-hour, two-year program. Milligan University also offers an Education Specialist degree that leads to certification as a school administrator. The Education Specialist (Ed.S.) program is a 39-hour program. In addition to completing coursework, candidates must pass Tennessee licensure exams to obtain the leadership endorsement. The instructional leader programs leverage the strengths of Milligan's education faculty, curriculum, and school partnerships to prepare school and district-level leaders. The program leads currently practicing teachers toward certification. Both programs are full-time, practice-based programs built on a cohort learning model of approximately 10-20 candidates progressing through the program together. Candidates complete clinical experiences in elementary, secondary, and district-office environments. Employment rates for graduates exceed the state average.

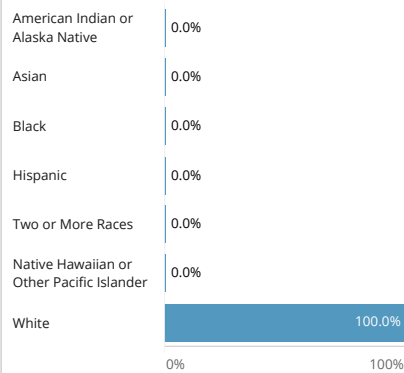

This metric indicates the number of cohort members in each of the three years included in this report card.

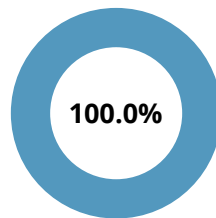
Completers by Race

Praxis Leader Licensure Pass Rate

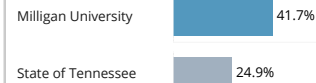
