




Leader Preparation


The Instructional Leadership (INSL) program in the College of Education and Human Sciences at Tennessee Technological University is designed to prepare educators seeking licensure as beginning administrators in Tennessee. The INSL program combines the Tennessee Instructional Leadership Standards (TILS), Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP) advanced-level standards, Tennessee Educator Acceleration Model (TEAM) Administrator Evaluation Rubric, and the Tennessee Literacy Standards for Instructional Leaders to provide candidates with a rigorous, performance-based curriculum that focuses on extensive coursework and field experiences guided by full-time faculty and district administrators. Candidate reflections, mentor evaluations, and Lead & Literacy action plans are integral to the successful completion of the program. Courses leading to the Master of Arts and Specialist in Education in INSL are available online through the Department of Curriculum and Instruction. The M.A. degree in INSL requires the successful completion of an approved program of study with a minimum of 33 semester hours. The Ed.S degree may be earned upon completion of 30 semester hours of approved graduate-level study beyond the M.A. degree. The INSL program requires candidates to submit a qualifying score on the School Leaders Licensure Assessment (SLLA) for degree completion and licensure recommendation.
