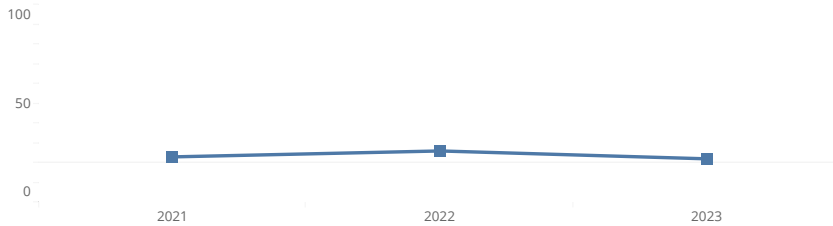

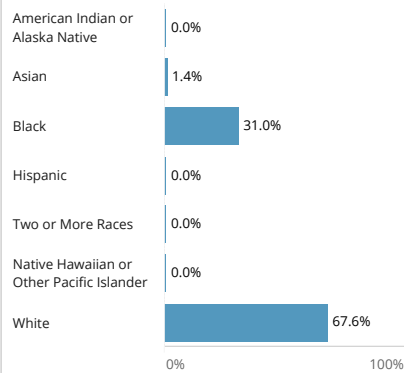

Cohort Members per Year

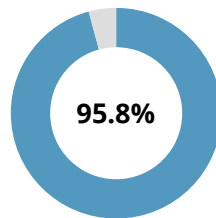

Completers by Race**What is this metric?**

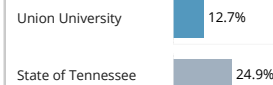
This metric shows the racial and ethnic composition of the three-year cohort.
