This report is published by the TBI presenting information on reported incidents of assaults or deaths of law enforcement officers in the line of duty that occurred in Tennessee. The information contained in the report is based on crime statistics information submitted by law enforcement agencies, colleges and universities in Tennessee to TBI's Tennessee Incident Based Reporting System (TIBRS) program. TIBRS is the state version of the FBI's National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS) program. I am very proud of the efforts of all participating law enforcement agencies in the state to provide the data necessary to produce this report. Our combined efforts have resulted in a successful program and this annual report providing information on incidents involving assaults and deaths of our law enforcement officers.

Law Enforcement Officers Killed or Assaulted 2017

The current report presents analyses of incidents in which Law Enforcement Officers were killed or assaulted in the line of duty in 2017. The information is collected through the Tennessee Incident Based Reporting System (TIBRS). Incident based reporting views a crime and all of its components as an “incident”. In order to obtain important information, facts recorded and preserved about the incident are organized into specific categories or segments. The vehicle used for recording these facts is a “data element”. Data elements provide information about crime and its involvement with victims, offenders, property, arrestees, etc.

Offenses included for analyses:

Murder and Non-negligent Manslaughter – The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.

Note: Deaths of Law Enforcement Officers by accidental causes do not meet the FBI’s reporting criteria for a LEOKA offense

Aggravated Assault – An unlawful attack by one person upon another wherein the offender uses a weapon or displays it in a threatening manner, or the victim suffers obvious severe or aggravated bodily injury involving apparent broken bones, loss of teeth, possible internal injury, severe laceration or loss of consciousness.

Simple Assault – An unlawful physical attack by one person upon another where neither the offender displays a weapon, nor the victim suffers obvious severe or aggravated bodily injury involving apparent broken bones, loss of teeth, possible internal injury, severe laceration or loss of consciousness.

Intimidation – To unlawfully place another person in reasonable fear of bodily harm through the use of threatening words and/or other conduct, but without displaying a weapon or subjecting the victim to actual physical attack.

Stalking – To intentionally and repeatedly follow or harass another person in such a manner as would cause that person to be in reasonable fear of being assaulted, suffering bodily injury or death.

In 2017, a total of 230 agencies reported Law Enforcement Officers Killed or Assaulted (LEOKA).




2017 LEOKA Quick Facts

- In 2017, there were a total of 2,137 LEOKA victims reported across the state.
- The number of reported LEOKA offenses increased by 14.7% from 2016 to 2017.
- Of the 2,137 LEOKA incidents reported in 2017, 85.6% were cleared by arrest.
- The most frequently reported offense was Simple Assault at 53.7%.
- The most common weapon type used by offender was Personal Weapons (Hands, Feet, Teeth, etc.) at 57.4%.
- The largest percentages of incidents reported occurred on Thursday (17.4%) and Tuesday (15.0%).
- Most LEOKA incidents occurred between 6:00pm and 11:59pm with Simple Assault being the most reported offense type.
- The location category of Residence/Home made up 29.7% of all reportable locations in TIBRS.
- The most frequently reported Vehicle Assignments were One Officer Vehicle-Assisted (40.2%) and One Officer Vehicle-Alone (29.0%).
- Responding to Disturbance Calls and Attempting Other Arrests were the most common Type of Activity reported by LEOKA victims in 2017.



The total number of LEOKA offenses increased by 14.7% from 2016 to 2017. Simple Assault offenses increased 13.8%. Zero Murder and Stalking offenses occurred in 2017. All other offenses shown in Chart 1 increased from 2014 to 2017.

Clearances



Incidents can either be cleared by arrest or by exceptional means such as the death of the offender or prosecution being declined. Of the 2,137 LEOKA incidents reported in 2017, 85.6% of them were cleared by arrest, 1.6% were cleared by exceptional means, and 12.8% were not cleared at the time of this report. Simple Assault accounted for the largest offense cleared by Arrest in 2017.

LEOKA Victims and Activity Type

Each time an officer is assaulted in the line of duty, the type of activity in which the officer was engaged at the time of the assault is reported. Twenty-nine percent of LEOKA victims in 2017 reported an activity type of Responding to Disturbance Calls.

An additional 19.0% of victims reported an activity type of Attempting Other Arrests. Robberies in Progress or Pursuing Robbery Suspects accounted for the least reported Activity Type in 2017.






Chart 3 displays the specific offense that was identified with the Top 5 Activity Types. Findings revealed that most Simple Assaults occurred when an officer was “Responding to Disturbance Call” and while “Attempting Other Arrests.” Meanwhile Aggravated Assaults occurred mostly when “Responding to a Disturbance Call” or “Traffic Pursuits and Stops.”

Victim Analysis



An analysis of LEOKA Victims by age and gender revealed that 45.0% of victims were aged 25 to 34 years old. Male officers accounted for 90.7% of all victims reported, whereas Female officers accounted for 9.3% in 2017.



Per TIBRS, Vehicle Assignment describes if the Law Enforcement Officer was alone or assisted during a LEOKA incident. Additionally, “Other (Alone)” refers to officers assaulted while in other capacities, (i.e. foot patrol), and “Other (Assisted)” refers to law enforcement assistance only. Forty percent of LEOKA victims had a Vehicle Assignment of One-Officer Vehicle (Assisted), whereas 29.0% had a Vehicle Assignment of One-Officer Vehicle (Alone).


Further findings revealed that the most frequent offense reported with One-Officer Vehicle (Alone) assignment was Simple Assault 50.4%.

LEOKA Locations

Findings on Type of Location revealed that most offenses occurred in Residence/Home locations at 29.7% of all reported locations in 2017. Highway/Road/Alley made up the second highest reported location which constituted 25.3% of all reportable locations in TIBRS.

Notably, Simple Assault against an officer occurred predominately in Residence/Home locations. Whereas, Aggravated Assault against an officer was reported frequently with the location of Highway/Road/Alley.

Findings on Intimidation revealed that there is little variation between Residence/Home and Highway/Road/Alley locations in 2017.




Timing of LEOKA Incidents

The time frame of LEOKA incidents is an important element to consider while examining data. Thursday (17.4%), Tuesday (15.0%) and Friday (14.4%) had the highest amount of LEOKA incidents in comparison to the other days of the week. Monday had the least reported incidents in 2017.

Further analysis indicated that most incidents occurred between 6:00 p.m. and 11:59 p.m. with Simple Assault being the most common offense, followed by 3:00 p.m. - 5:59 p.m. The time frame with the least reported incidents in 2017, was from 3:00 a.m. to 5:59 a.m.

Chart 9 demonstrates the monthly breakdown of the 2,137 LEOKA incidents in 2017. January (10.0%) accounted for the highest reported month in LEOKA incidents, followed by May (9.2%) and August (9.2%). LEOKA incidents decreased by 3.3% from 196 in May to 127 incidents in June—the lowest reported month in 2017.

Findings in data revealed that Simple Assault and Aggravated Assault against a police officer made up the highest reported offense types in 2017.



LEOKA Injuries and Weapons Used

Injury Type is a required data element when reporting Aggravated and Simple Assaults. There were 1,999 reported injury types in 2017; of those, 69.5% of injury types were classified as None and 26.4% were reported as an Apparent Minor Injury.

Per TIBRS, up to five injuries can be reported per victim.



The table to the left displays the weapon types used to assault officers who were involved in LEOKA incident in 2017.


The weapon category of Personal Weapons (Hands, Feet, Teeth, Etc.) was the most frequently reported weapon type at 57.4%. Motor Vehicle as Weapon accounted for 18.1%.

Overall, firearms made up 9.5% of total weapons reported with LEOKA incidents. Per TIBRS, up to three weapons can be reported.

Offender Analysis



The majority of offenders in LEOKA incidents were males (74.9%). Females, in contrast, made up 24.3% of all reported offenders. Males aged 25-34 accounted for the highest age group category in 2017. Unknown Gender and Unknown Age only made up 0.8% of all offenders and therefore not included in Chart 10.



Further analysis on offender data indicated that the majority of offenders were White at 67.5 % or Black or African American at 31.0%. Eighteen offenders in 2017 were reported with an Unknown Gender and 25 were reported with an Unknown Race. The remaining of the offenders—Asian and American Indian or Alaska Native — accounted for 0.2% each. Zero offenders with the race of Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander were reported in 2017.
