## Reporting Tip of the Month—Cargo Theft

Per the TIBRS Manual, 14<sup>th</sup> Ed., pg. 14: Cargo Theft is the taking of any cargo including, but not limited to, goods, chattels, money, or baggage that constitutes, in whole or in part, a commercial shipment of freight moving in commerce, from any pipeline system, railroad car, motor-truck or other motor vehicle, or from any tank or storage facility, station house, platform, or depot or from any vessel or wharf, or from any aircraft, air terminal, airport, aircraft terminal, or air navigation facility, or from any intermodal container, intermodal chassis, trailer, container freight station, warehouse, freight distribution facility, or freight consolidation facility. That is a long definition that says if goods are moving in commerce from Point A to Point B, or any other point between A and B, and they are stolen, Cargo Theft would be Yes.

For example, a tractor-trailer loaded with furniture is in transit from the factory in Knoxville to the show room in Memphis. The driver stops at a truck stop in Nashville for lunch. When the driver finishes his meal and returns to his rig to discover the trailer missing along with the furniture. Cargo Theft would be marked **Yes**.

A family is on their way to vacation in the Smokies. They stop for lunch. When they come out of the restaurant, they find the window on their vehicle broken and their luggage stolen. This would be Theft from a Motor Vehicle and Cargo Theft would be **No**. Why? This was not goods in transit, but personal belongings.

There are 15 applicable offenses for Cargo Theft:

Robbery	Fraud, Identity Theft
Theft From a Building	Fraud, Computer Hacking/Invasion
Theft From a Motor Vehicle	Extortion/Blackmail
All Other Larceny	Burglary
Fraud, False Pretenses/Swindle/Con	Motor Vehicle Theft
Fraud, Credit Card/ATM	Embezzlement
Fraud, Impersonation	Bribery
Fraud, Wire Fraud

## TIBRS Training Tip of the Month

**VANDALISM**  
**INTENTIONAL**  
 DESTRUCTION/DAMAGE OF PROPERTY

KEY POINT #2

**VANDALISM TO VEHICLES**

Whenever a vehicle is vandalized, the correct property category is NEVER Vehicle Parts/Accessories.

The correct property category is the VEHICLE TYPE (Automobile, Bus, Truck, etc.).



We still occasionally see motor vehicles incorrectly classified as “Vehicle Parts/Accessories.” If someone vandalizes a motor vehicle, the correct property category is the vehicle type. Make sure you are entering these types of property correctly.

## Accessing N-DEx through RISS

Investigators and intelligence analysts should take advantage of the FBI’s free searchable database N-DEx (National Data Exchange). For access to N-DEx through RISS, your agency has must be a member of ROCIC. Below is the contact information to obtain an account or to find out if your agency is a member.
