**Tennessee Commission on Children and Youth
Youth Excellence Award**

PURPOSE:

The objective of the Tennessee Commission on Children and Youth, through the Youth Excellence Award, is to recognize and honor a young adult who has made great strides in his or her life from past involvement with the juvenile justice system. This person will have overcome great obstacles and is currently making positive contributions to society. *This award was modeled on the Coalition of Juvenile Justice Spirit of Youth Award.*

CRITERIA:

The award recipient must be:

- Under the age of 28 years;
- Not a member of the Tennessee Commission on Children and Youth or the Coalition for Juvenile Justice;
- A person who was involved in the court system as a juvenile;
- Currently involved, directly or indirectly, in bettering the lives of "at-risk" youth.

NOMINATIONS:

All members of the Tennessee Commission on Children and Youth will actively promote the Youth Excellence Award by distributing nomination forms to their local juvenile justice agencies and community organizations. They will also want to contact their local media sources to publicize the award and to detail the nomination process.

The executive director of the Tennessee Commission on Children and Youth will appoint one staff person as the direct liaison for this program. All nominations will be sent to this person, and the staff person will be responsible for distributing the nomination forms to the Youth Excellence Award selection committee. The staff person, along with the executive director, will be responsible for publicizing the award to local and state press, through Regional Councils, newsletter articles, including *The Advocate*, and on the Tennessee Commission on Children and Youth Web Site.

All nominations will be submitted using a standard application form and sent to the Tennessee Commission on Children and Youth office in Nashville. Commission staff members will maintain strict levels of confidentiality when handling the application forms, as the forms may contain sensitive information about nominees.

The Youth Excellence Award selection committee will review and discuss all nominations, and identify three top candidates ranked in order of preference. The selection committee will then present the top three names and their nomination forms to the Tennessee Commission on Children and Youth for a final decision and approval.

PRESENTATION:

The Tennessee Commission on Children and Youth will invite the recipient to receive the award, generally at Children’s Advocacy Day each year.

The award recipient will be asked to sign a release form granting the Tennessee Commission on Children and Youth permission to use the descriptive material and photos without compensation for the sole purpose of promoting recognition for the recipient, the award and the Commission.

The recipient will be announced to the news media and will receive the following from the Commission:

- A plaque;
- An entry on the plaque in the Commission’s Nashville office that lists Youth Excellence Award recipients for each year.

DEADLINE FOR NOMINATIONS:

Deadline for 2021 nominations is February 12, 2021.

SELECTION COMMITTEE:

The Chair of the Tennessee Commission on Children and Youth shall appoint a selection committee and a chair for the selection committee. The selection committee shall consist of all youth members of the Commission who are able and willing to serve. The total number of members on the selection committee shall not exceed seven.

PRINCIPLES FOR SELECTING THE RECIPIENT OF THE
TENNESSEE COMMISSION ON CHILDREN AND YOUTH
YOUTH EXCELLENCE AWARD

*Please read before you begin the scoring process,
keeping these principles in mind.*

The following principles form a conceptual framework to consider while reviewing the nomination forms:

Common Agenda: There must be no political or philosophical agenda on the part of the nominator and/or nominee that would contradict or undermine the positions held by the Tennessee Commission on Children and Youth's public positions or stated goals.

Nominee's Achievements: The focus of the award is to honor a person's ability to overcome obstacles and challenges and make positive strides in his or her life, not to gain public attention for an organization or program.

Credibility: The application and all supporting materials must provide evidence that the nominee has in fact accomplished the successes, etc., cited by the nominator.

Non-Bias: No bias, positive or negative, should be used based on the nominee's place of residence nor the location or extent of the nominee's involvement with the juvenile justice system, nor other factors related to gender, race/ethnicity, political or social orientation, except as related to the above stated principals.

Conflict of Interest: No member of the Tennessee Commission on Children and Youth who may have a close relationship or personal knowledge of the nominee or nominator will be able to participate in scoring the application.

Confidentiality: All applications, including the names of nominees, nominators and other details, are to be held in the strictest confidence. All committee discussions regarding the nominations will also be completely confidential.
