Parents as Teachers' Black Doulas Group Lends Support to Moms' Birthing Process. A doula is a trained professional who provides emotional, physical, and educational support to an expectant mother during pregnancy, labor, and in the weeks following birth. As additional, non-clinical supports to new mothers, doulas work to improve health outcomes and help mothers design a birth plan and advocate for themselves during pregnancy, during the birthing process, and beyond.

The Kids of Rutherford County



In the spring of 2016, a video of kids fighting in Rutherford County, was posted on the internet and caught the attention of a local police officer. She began an investigation that led to the arrest of 11 Black schoolchildren, some as young as 8 years old, for watching the fight and not stopping it.

The arrests rattled the local
