

CONFIDENTIAL INFORMANT DEVELOPMENT

This 8-hour, tuition-free Multijurisdictional Counterdrug Training course is designed to develop an understanding of criminal gang confidential informant source development beginning at identification. Fundamentals include communication, listening and interpretation, which are important for cultivating criminal gang informants. The course provides team building, gang communication skills, gang language, types of informants, the recruitment process, three keys to informant success, management, payments, policy, procedure, milestones, written reports, and guidelines for success. Attendees will learn proven and reliable identification options for source development, accompanied by strategies for long-term maximum possibilities. They will be taught proven communication options and techniques to "flip" or craft the potential source for harvest and begin to develop their own sources for any investigation.

He began his law enforcement career in 1994 as a Jail Deputy with the Canyon County Sheriff's Department. In 1995, Mr. Montoya transferred to the Narcotics Division where he primarily worked undercover assisting other State and Federal Agencies. He was also select for S.W.A.T. serving as an Entry Operator and K9 Handler. In 1998, he was promoted to Sergeant where he served as the Supervisor for a Multi-Jurisdictional Narcotics Unit. In 2003, Mr. Montoya was promoted to Lieutenant overseeing the Criminal Investigation Division and was appointed to S.W.A.T. Commander. In 2007, Mr. Montoya began working for the Boise Police Department. During his time with B.P.D. Mr. Montoya was assigned to the Narcotics Division along with being selected to the Special Operations Group. As a Narcotics Detective Mr. Montoya continued to work undercover assisting other State and Federal agencies as an FBI Task Force Officer along with training new Narcotics Officers. As a member of the Special Operation Group he served as an Entry Operator, and Sniper as well as being trained as a Hostage Negotiator. Mr. Montoya holds degrees in Criminal Justice and Psychology as well as a Law Enforcement Masters certificate.
