



Funding



In FY 2017 - 2018, the 4.5% state sales tax imposed on a person's purchase of aviation fuel used in the operation of airplane or aircraft motors shall not exceed \$14,125,000 for any taxpayer.

In FY 2018 - 2019, the aviation fuel tax shall not exceed \$10,500,000.






