21	As a result, TDOT initiated the project	05:32:07
22	to reconstruct State Route 115 between Singleton	05:32:09
23	Station Road and the Little River, creating a	05:32:11
24	six-lane fully controlled access roadway separating	05:32:15
25	local traffic from commuter through traffic.	05:32:17

1 The proposed project is intended to 05:32:18 2 address transportation needs which help to identify 05:32:23 3 through coordination with local officials, agencies, 05:32:23 and the public. Those transportation needs include 05:32:28 4 increasing the capacity of Alcoa Highway and level 05:32:32 5 of service, correct roadway deficiencies, reduce 05:32:36 6 crashes, and improve safety. 05:32:37 7 This section of the Alcoa Highway 05:32:44 8 improvements is one project working in conjunction 05:32:45 9 10 with six other active TDOT projects, stretching from 05:32:49 11 along the State 115 corridor between UT Hospital and 05:32:53 12 McGhee-Tyson Airport. 05:33:01 Knox County section from Malone Road to 13 05:33:05 14 Woodson Drive is currently under construction. 05:33:08 15 Construction plans are currently scheduled to begin 05:33:12 16 in the Spring 2019 for two other sections: Knox 05:33:12 17 County, from south of Topside to Malone Road, and 05:33:15 Blount County, from State Route 45 Hull Road to a 18 05:33:20 19 proposed interchange at Tyson Boulevard. 05:33:24 2.0 Three of the remaining four sections, 05:33:28 21 05:33:30 Knox County from Woodson Drive to Cherokee Trail; 22 Blount County, Pellissippi Parkway to South 05:33:31 Singleton Station Road; and Blount County, from the 23 05:33:35 2.4 proposed interchange at Tyson Boulevard to 05:33:38 25 Pellissippi Parkway are currently in the 05:33:38

right-of-way appraisal in acquisition phase.

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The final section, Blount County from Singleton Station Road to south of the Little River, is currently in the preliminary design phase and is the focus of tonight's meeting.

This section, called the Little River section, is currently under design. It begins here, at Singleton Station Road. This section ties into the Blount County relocated Alcoa Highway section from the south. It continues north about two miles of the existing Little River Bridge at the Blount County/Knox County line. When the relocated Alcoa Highway project to the south and the Little River projects are completed, commuter and through traffic will have a fully controlled access facility to State Route 45 to the Blount County/Knox County line at the Little River.

In order to achieve the purpose and need of improved safety and added capacity, as well as maintaining traffic during construction, this section proposes improvements to Alcoa Highway through upgrading the existing four-lane roadway to a six-lane controlled access facility with frontage roads and interchanges. TDOT chose to expand the proposed roadway to the west in order to minimize

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impacts and to eliminate traffic on roadway during construction. Widening to the west enabled TDOT to reuse the existing northbound travel lanes by converting them to a northbound frontage road.

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Access on the southbound side of Alcoa Highway will be maintained by building a southbound frontage road to the west. The northbound and the southbound frontage roads will have access ramps to and from the new proposed Alcoa Highway. New access ramps will allow traffic to make safer on-and-off maneuvers to and from the newly-constructed Alcoa Highway. A barrier wall will separate the Alcoa Highway northbound and southbound traffic and eliminate the dangerous left turns across through traffic.

Let's look at a few of the key features. Starting at the southern end of the projects, Alcoa Highway and the Pellissippi Parkway interchange will be shifted east as part of the relocated Alcoa Highway Project. Old Alcoa Highway, or the Motor Mile, will remain in place in operation in order to maintain access to homes and businesses along the existing route to the south. Ramps will provide access to and from old Alcoa Highway and Singleton Station Road.

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1 Instead of Singleton Station Road 05:36:22 2 05:36:24 intersecting Alcoa Highway as it is today, an 3 interchange will separate through traffic on Alcoa 05:36:28 Highway with the local traffic on Singleton Station 05:36:32 4 The new frontage roads begin here at 05:36:35 5 Road. Singleton Station Road and continue north, allowing 05:36:40 6 7 motorists to access the businesses and homes along 05:36:41 the corridor. 05:36:44 8 Additionally, a greenway trail begins in 05:36:46 9 10 the area surrounding, which facilitates pedestrian 05:36:46 11 and Pellissippi travel. The greenway trail extends 05:36:48 across the Little River Bridge and onto the next 12 05:36:53 13 design section in Knox County. 05:36:57 14 North of Singleton Station Road, the 05:37:07 15 frontage roads and ramps intersect to create an 05:37:08 16 efficient free-flow intersection called a double 05:37:12 17 teardrop roundabout, which allows traffic to 05:37:18 18 access destinations on both sides of Alcoa Highway 05:37:21 19 without stopping at a traffic signal. 05:37:22 2.0 05:37:34 Continuing north to Topside Road, 21 05:37:38 another double teardrop roundabout interchange 22 provides access to and from Alcoa Highway. Alcoa 05:37:41 Way will be extended to Topside Road to provide 23 05:37:48 2.4 access to properties located to the north of Topside 05:37:51 25 05:37:54 Road and west of Alcoa Highway.

River Trace subdivision's access will be 05:37:56 relocated south to connect to the new Topside Road 05:37:58 interchange, providing safer access to Alcoa 05:38:01 Highway. During construction, access will be 05:38:05 maintained to homes and businesses along the 05:38:09 existing roadway. 05:38:12 Let's now take a look at how the new 05:38:15 Alcoa Highway and frontage roads will function. 05:38:18 Traffic leaving Knoxville and other destinations to 05:38:21 the north will be able to use the new Alcoa Highway 05:38:22 and will be separated from local traffic. Traffic 05:38:28 traveling south will have the option of taking Old 05:38:33 Alcoa Highway to the Motor Mile or continuing south 05:38:39 to nearby destinations along the relocated Alcoa 05:38:41

It's important to remember that there are

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trips as well.

Local traffic traveling north will be able to access Singleton Station Road and the Motor Mile via a new interchange at Singleton Station Road. The unique feature of the northbound offramp is that the ramp will split to accommodate high expected traffic volumes and providing easier access to local destinations. Motorists will have the

plenty of access points along the way for local

Here at Lakemont, the double teardrop 05:39:58 15 roundabout underpass will provide safe and simple 05:40:03 16 access to both sides of Alcoa Highway without the 05:40:04 17 use of a traffic signal. 05:40:06 18 As we continue to the north, another double 05:40:19 19 teardrop roundabout interchange at Topside Road 05:40:20 provides access to Rivertrace Subdivision and other 2.0 05:40:24 21 local destinations. 05:40:27 22 On the west side of Alcoa Highway, a new 05:40:33 23 Alcoa Way and greenway will lead to local homes and 05:40:36 2.4 businesses as well as pedestrians to access Topside 05:40:39 25 Road, frontage roads, and Alcoa Highway. 05:40:44 The new

1 greenway is located on the west side of Alcoa 05:40:50 Highway and enables pedestrian access to both sides 2 05:40:53 of the corridor. Like northbound frontage road, 3 05:40:54 the southbound frontage road will be one way. 05:40:59 4 Heading south, all access is provided among 05:41:08 5 6 the corridor by new frontage road while 05:41:12 7 circulation's provided by the double teardrop 05:41:16 roundabouts. At the Singleton Station Road 05:41:20 8 05:41:21 9 interchange, the southbound frontage road and ramps 10 will provide access back to the Motor Mile, as well 05:41:21 11 as to the new Alcoa Highway. 05:41:24 12 This graphic highlights the traffic 05:44:53 13 development process for transportation projects. 05:44:55 14 TDOT is approaching the end of the design phase for 05:44:56 15 this section of the State Route 115 project. 05:45:00 16 next stage includes purchasing the necessary 05:45:04 17 right-of-way and easements.
