2017 Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement (CMAQ) Program



CMAQ Overview

The federal Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement (CMAQ) program provides dedicated funding to state Departments of Transportation for projects that improve air quality and reduce congestion. The CMAQ program accomplishes these goals by providing funding to eligible entities in Tennessee, and that meet three requirements:

- 1. Must be a transportation project;
- 2. Must be located in or benefit a non-attainment or maintenance area (Image below); and,
- 3. Must have an emissions reduction benefit.

- Projects must demonstrate a reduction in mobile source emissions in one or more CMAQeligible counties.
- The grant competition is open to both public and private entities (*private companies require a public sponsor*).
