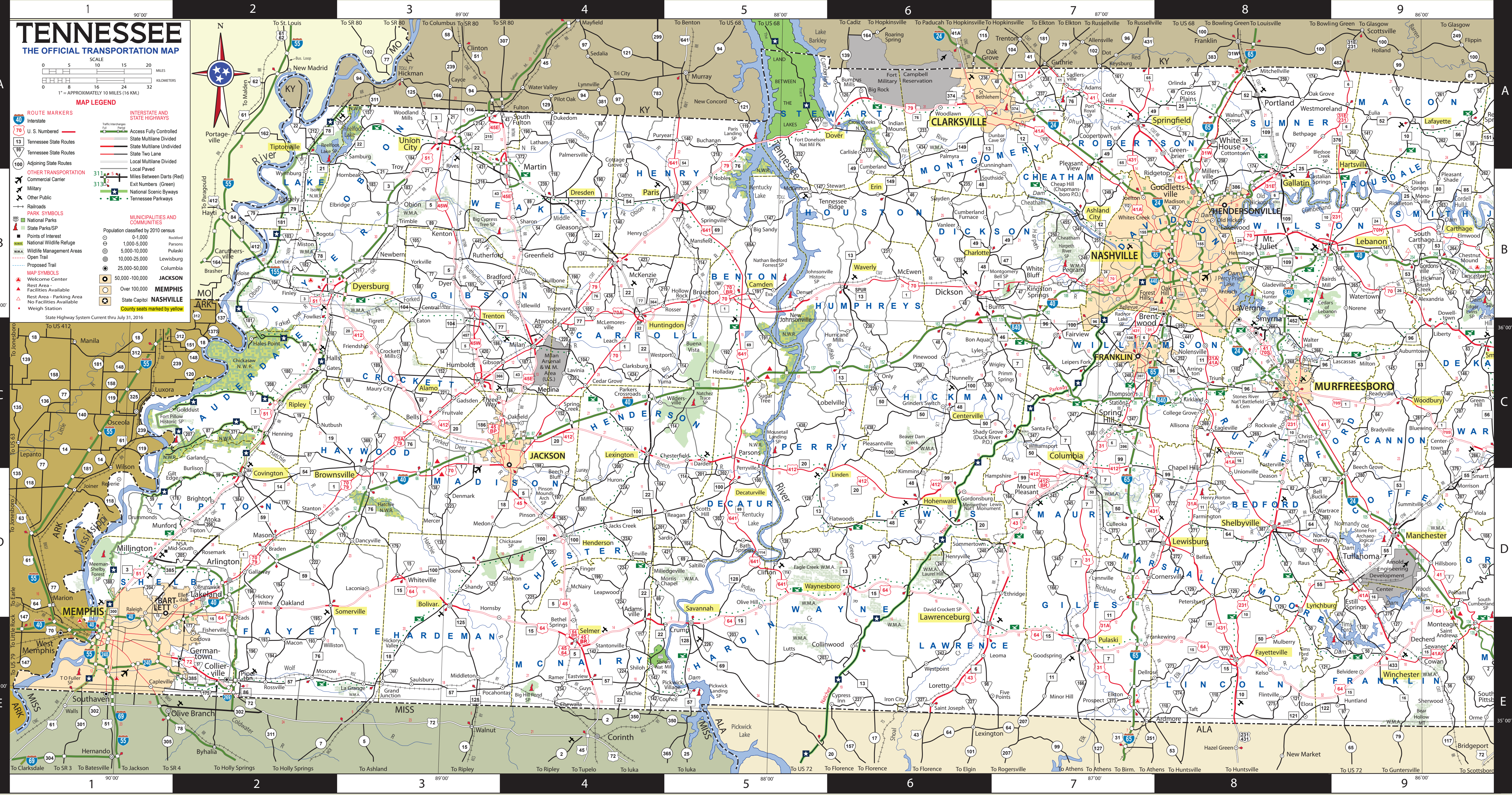
Welcome Centers
The Tennessee Department of Tourist Development operates 15 welcome centers along the interstate highway system. These centers are staffed 24 hours a day, seven days a week, except for the I-40 Shelby County Welcome Center at Riverside Drive, which closes each evening. The Tennessee Department of Transportation operates 19 additional rest areas. See locator on the back cover of this publication. All facilities provide information racks, restrooms and vending machines. The centers do not provide garbage waste dumps and overnight parking is not allowed. In case of an emergency, call 911 or "(star) THP."
