Prequalifications Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

- 1. Why doesn't my approval letter show Function (Experience) Codes?
  - Function (Experience) Codes can be found on the website, which is updated three times a week. You can access them <u>here</u>.
- 2. Is the maximum limit of 20 resumes per location or for the entire firm?
  The 20-resume limit applies to the entire firm.
- 3. If a position in the company doesn't have a corresponding code, should it still be listed in the chart?
  - Yes, these positions should be listed under "Other Employees.
- 4. Can you provide a sample of a correctly completed prequalification form?
  - A sample form can be found here: <u>Prequalified Consultant Form</u>.
- 5. Can we extend the prequalification form if more space is needed?
  - No, please use an additional DT-0330 form if more space is required.
- 6. If our prequalification doesn't expire for several months or up to a year, do we need to update it now?
  - You can update it at any time within the 2.9-years prequalification period.
- 7. When submitting an update package, do we need to include only the changed forms or the entire packet?
  - Only include the forms for offices that have changed. If changes apply to all offices, then submit all updated forms.
- 8. Can we submit fewer than 20 resumes, or are 20 required?
  - You may submit fewer than 20 resumes to cover key personnel. The maximum allowed is 20 resumes per firm.
- 9. Can Consultants with Limited Status propose as Subconsultants on contracts over \$250,000?
  - Yes, if the Limited Status firm does not exceed \$250,000 per contract.
- 10. Is there a limit to the number of offices we can submit?
  - Yes, a firm can submit a maximum of 30 offices.
- 11. If we were previously approved for Utility codes under the old system, do we need to update them now for the new codes?
  - No update is needed solely for Utility codes. If you're updating other codes or renewing, you will need to use the new codes.
- 12. Do we need to prequalify an out-of-state office if the TN office is already prequalified for the relevant code?
  - Yes, if a supporting office is located out of state, it must also be prequalified (e.g., if structures are managed in TN but you have a structures person in GA, the GA office would need prequalification).
