



TDOT and WeGo's Partnership Promotes Choice Lanes: Promoting Congestion Reduction and Increased Ridership

The Tennessee Department of Transportation (TDOT) and WeGo Public Transit have teamed up to promote the proposed Choice Lanes on the I-24 Southeast corridor. The proposed project aims to reduce congestion and through the partnership, enhance transit options, benefiting commuters across the region.

TDOT and WeGo share a vision of providing reliable travel times for everyone. By promoting WeGo transit in the future Choice Lanes, they will offer a dependable alternative for both passenger and transit vehicles. Transit buses can use these lanes for free, improving on-time performance and making public transit even more attractive without extra costs for riders.

Through the [Community Impact Partner \(CIP\) Program](#), TDOT is promoting the benefits of the proposed future Choice Lanes to WeGo's riders with posters at transit shelters in South Nashville. This effort highlights TDOT's commitment to supporting multimodal transportation and enhancing travel efficiency.

This event reached a diverse audience, fostering open discussion about the project and encouraging feedback.
