

# Nolensville Pike / State Route 11 Widening Newsletter

### Phase 1 Project Description:

The project widens Nolensville Pike from a two-lane to a five-lane road (including a dedicated turn lane and bike lanes). It stretches from south of Burkitt Road to near SR 254 (Old Hickory Boulevard). The project includes reconstruction and widening for approximately 4.4 miles. The proposed improvements are intended to address congestion, improve safety, and accommodate growth in this rapidly developing area.

Due to the size of improvements to SR 11, TDOT has split this project into two phases. Phase One, from north of Mill Creek to near SR 254 in southern Davidson County, is currently under construction.

#### Phase 1 Progress

- Completed Work:
  - Storm drainage structures placed
  - Buried utilities (water, sewer, and gas) installed
  - Utility poles and overhead electric placed along the south end of the project (Bluff Road to Shane Point Place)
  - Holt Road construction: Phase One grading completed and new utility poles set with overhead electric

#### • Active Work:

- Drilling and placing soldier piles and pouring concrete wall panels for retaining wall five; placing concrete wall panels for retaining wall two
- Constructing retaining wall seven
- Setting utility poles and placing overhead electric along the north end of the project (Shane Point Place to Old Hickory Boulevard)
- Grading operations throughout the project
- Water, sewer, and gas installation
- Phase One storm drainage placement
- Holt Road construction: telecommunication relocation in preparation for Phase Two blasting/grade work
