WHAT IS TRIP?

- TRIP IS A QUICK CLEARANCE INCENTIVE PROGRAM THAT PARTNERS AGENCIES WITH HEAVY DUTY TOWING COMPANIES
- PERFORMANCE BASED FOCUSED ON SAFETY, RAPID RESPONSE AND LANE CLEARANCE WITHIN 90 MINUTES
- STANDARDIZES THE TOWING RESPONSE
- ESTABLISHES CLEAR AND CONSISTENT EXPECTATIONS AMONGST T.I.M. STAKEHOLDERS
- PROVIDES A FRAMEWORK OF OPERATIONS
- BUILDS SOLID RELATIONSHIPS
- ALLOWS FOR LESSONS TO BE SHARED

HISTORY OF DEVELOPMENT AND FUNDING

- Mid-2000's: Statewide TIM Group was looking at the feasibility of TRIP
- Assigned to the Virginia Transportation Research Council to investigate
- Forwarded through FHWA
- Early VDOT Champions: Operations Division
- VSP brought into the fold during the FHWA analysis for buy in
- Identified need for legislative support
- Delayed the Pilot Program by one year
- HB 2020: Hold Harmless Legislation/2017
- Outreach and development 2017
- Go Live: December 17, 2017
- Research Council funded with FHWA grant

- 633 miles of interstate coverage
- 5 VDOT Districts/ 4 Traffic Operation centers
- 6 State Police Divisions/ 6 VSP Dispatch Centers
- VDOT TOC Activates TRIP response
- 37 Towing companies
- Custom Design Recovery Zones
- Standardized Response for all TRIP activations
- Preset Response Time Expectations
- 90-minute clearance goals for live lanes
- All within the ICS™ structure
- Expansion underway: I-85 & I-77

Equipment/ Personnel Requirements

- 25-ton dual axle and one 50-ton wrecker (or 35-ton Rotator)
- Support truck/trailer including a full set of tools and additional resources.
- A 3-man team response to every TRIP crash
- Other specialized equipment
- 24/7 equipment availability









Training Requirements

- TRIP Level 1 and Level 2 training provided by WreckMaster
 - TRIP Level 1- Operators
 - TRIP Level 2- Supervisor
- Hazardous Material awareness/ Hazwoper 24 or 40 hour
- SHRP2 Responder Training
- NIMS 100 & 700
- VDOT Basic Work Zone Training
- Continuing Education Req.
- Full Training for TRIP responders

- TT ~100 feet of guardrail and a bridge; OT on shoulder
- Tractor destroyed, cargo tank ruptured, leaking fuel/cargo into drainage culvert;
 ~4,100 gallons spilled
- VDEM & regional HAZMAT team responded; detour put in place













- Separate casualty; 20-minute TRIP stop time
- Winched tractor to road, loaded onto large rollback
- Upright trailer; road tractor to tow
- Cedar Hill completed HAZMAT cleanup

- Average Lane Clearance for the Recovery: 45 Minutes
- Lane Clearance with 90 minutes: 90%
- Average Total Scene Clearance 2 hours 31 minutes
