



Facility Mission: Provide Middle Tennessee a healthcare setting for low-acuity COVID-19 patients in the event that existing hospital capacity in the region is exceeded.

Location: 1818 Albion St. Nashville, TN 37208 (2nd and 8th Floors of Nashville General Hospital)

Types of Patients:

- The facility is designed to accept COVID-19 positive patients with low to moderate acuity disease, who are too sick to be discharged home and require some hospital level support, including oxygen.
- Patients will only be accepted as transfers from hospitals.
- The facility is not designed to support care for complex medical conditions or interventions. Patients whose clinical status decompensates will be transferred to a higher level of care at Nashville General Hospital or other area facilities as appropriate.
- Based on available data from studies of COVID patients, the average length of stay for a person admitted to the Alternate Care Site at Nashville General Hospital is expected to be up to four days.



Site Design/Facility Capacity:

- 67 patients on two floors requiring hospital care for COVID-19.
- 5 nursing stations, which will be staffed by multiple nurses and nursing assistants, overseeing care of the patients.
- All patient care areas can simultaneously provide oxygen.
- The facility will have the ability to provide basic laboratory services and chest x-rays.
- Construction took place over 25 days under the supervision of the US Army Corps of Engineers and hundreds of subcontractors working in multiple shifts around the clock to complete the project on time.
- The Nashville alternate care site is unique in that it is built within an existing hospital.



Staffing Support:

- Physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, pharmacists, nurses, nursing assistants, pharmacy technicians, respiratory therapists, social workers, case management, radiology technicians, emergency medical technicians, law enforcement, security, environmental services and food services.
- The executive leadership team from the Nashville General Hospital will provide the administrative and medical support for the day to day operations of the facility.
- The site is supported by the Federal Emergency Management Agency, Tennessee Emergency Management Agency, Tennessee Department of Health, the Metro Public Health Department and the Nashville Davidson County Mayor’s Office.
