

Notice of Change to the TennCare III Demonstration

Distribution of Uncompensated Care Funds

December 21, 2023

The Commissioner of the Tennessee Department of Finance & Administration is providing official notification of a planned change to the TennCare demonstration. This change involves modifications to TennCare's distribution of uncompensated care payments to hospitals. TennCare is publishing this notice pursuant to the terms and conditions of the TennCare demonstration in order to solicit public input on this planned change.

Description of Planned Program Change

Since 2016, the TennCare demonstration has included a Virtual DSH Fund and an Uncompensated Care Fund for Charity Care (also referred to as the "Charity Care Fund"). Monies from these funds are used to support Tennessee hospitals by helping to offset costs associated with providing uncompensated care. TennCare distributes funds from the Virtual DSH Fund and the Charity Care Fund to qualifying hospitals according to an established distribution methodology. TennCare is providing public notice of its intent to modify its distribution methodology for uncompensated care payments to reflect updates for State Fiscal Year 2024. This change will become effective February 19, 2024.

Expected Impact on Enrollment and Expenditures

This change will not result in the enrollment of additional persons in the TennCare program.



The implementation of this change is expected to result in a one-time, non-recurring increase of up to \$8,104,754 in aggregate expenditures during Demonstration Year 4 of the TennCare III demonstration, reflecting a non-recurring appropriation by the General Assembly for payments to Critical Access Hospitals (CAHs) in State Fiscal Year 2024.

Waiver and Expenditure Authorities Requested

TennCare is not requesting any new waiver or expenditure authorities under Section 1115 of the Social Security Act to implement these changes. The Virtual DSH Fund and the Charity Care Fund are already approved components of the TennCare demonstration. Under the terms of the TennCare III demonstration, TennCare may make modifications to the methodology for distributing payments from these funds, subject to public notice and notification to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS).

Public Notice Process

TennCare has taken a variety of steps to ensure that members of the public are notified of this planned change to the TennCare program. These measures include the development and maintenance of this webpage, as well as notices published in newspapers of general circulation in Tennessee communities with 50,000 or more residents. In addition, TennCare has disseminated information about this proposed change via its social media accounts (e.g., Facebook, X/Twitter).

Public Input Process

TennCare is seeking feedback on this planned change. Members of the public are invited to offer comments regarding this change from December 21, 2023, through January 19, 2024.
