

Wave 6 episodes TAG- Call for nominations due July 28, 2016

- The Tennessee Health Care Innovation Initiative is seeking nominees for clinical experts to advise on the design of Wave 6 episodes of care.
- We are looking for clinicians who are thought leaders in their fields, representative of practicing providers, enthusiastic about improving care delivery, and available to attend all TAG meetings (for the topic they are nominated) in Nashville.
- Wave 6 episodes of care include:
 - Outpatient skin and soft tissue infection
 - HIV
 - Neonatal (multiple)
 - Pancreatitis
 - Diabetes acute exacerbation

State SIM Population Health Improvement Update

- **7/1 – State Health Plan submitted to Governor Haslam**
- Upcoming:
 - Develop Tennessee-specific set of Vital Signs metrics to measure health and progress in the state
 - Held a workshop with TDH Executive Leadership Team on 6/22
 - Next Steps:
 - Seek additional input from TDH. (August)
 - » Considering a survey and additional workshops
 - » Planning to tweak the design/approach of the workshop to allow more flexibility in the framework and organization
 - Hold similar workshops across the state to garner buy-in from stakeholders and the public. (October – November)
 - » Hoping to leverage relationships with PH schools from SIM work to host
 - » Proposed Locations: Memphis, Jackson, Nashville, Chattanooga, Knoxville, Tri-Cities
 - » Engaging a more robust, diverse, and multi-sector audience
 - Finalize a set of Tennessee-specific Vital Signs. (Q1 2017)
 - Create plan of action to expand upon PHIP foundation for future updates to the State Health Plan (including the incorporation of Physical Activity Plan and Oral Health Plan)



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Episodes of Care- Annual Feedback Sessions



On July 19, 2016, the feedback sessions took place simultaneously in six locations across the state linking clinicians, administrators, payors and other stakeholders by video-conference in Nashville, Chattanooga, Knoxville, Johnson City, Jackson and Memphis.

Episodes of Care- Annual Feedback Session

- This feedback session provided the opportunity for the public to comment on what is working well with each episode's clinical design and where providers would suggest changes for next year.
- Eight episodes of care (Waves 1 and 2) were open for public feedback including:
 - Perinatal,
 - acute asthma exacerbation,
 - total joint replacement,
 - screening and surveillance colonoscopy,
 - chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) acute exacerbation,
 - outpatient and non-acute inpatient cholecystectomy,
 - acute percutaneous coronary intervention (PCI), and
 - non-acute percutaneous coronary intervention (PCI)
- The feedback received will be reviewed and analyzed. Any changes to the episodes design will be communicated through a memorandum in the fall and made effective January 2017.

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Maternal Fetal Medicine (MFM) Exclusion from Perinatal Episode

- MFM providers are in a special situation in the perinatal episode.
 - MFMs provide care to the mother though many of the benefits are to the child.
- Eventually we would like to include services to the child in the perinatal episode in some way.
 - We will review the design of the perinatal episode as part of the neonatal TAG.
- As a temporary measure, we will be excluding perinatal episodes where an MFM delivers the baby, starting with the 2016 performance period.
