The 2022-2023 school year was the second year of operation for Nashville Collegiate Prep (NCP) and proved to be a successful year of growth as we serve the Southeast Nashville community. We are proud to have welcomed our first class of sixth graders as we continue to build out our K-8 model. The engaged, supportive, and rigorous instruction and community model pushed students to exceed growth targets and staff saw increased teacher efficacy through the feedback provided to teachers in the community model.

In our second year, NCP continued the effort to make our school a second "home" in the community for teachers, leaders, students, and families. Parents engaged in Title I meetings to learn more about community engagement and the school parent compact; attended Open House nights to connect virtually and have visibility into their students' schoolwork; brought their students to Math and Literacy Family Nights; and celebrated their students with end-of-the-year Awards Ceremonies. We are proud to partner with our parents to support the WHOLE child, and were consistently impressed by parent engagement in our second year.

NCP continued to reach new students by engaging with the community through regularly scheduled enrollment events and outreach through local businesses and partners. Throughout the school year, NCP hosted eight information sessions, a kindergarten enrollment event, and took part in events hosted by the Southeast Community Center, Plaza Mariachi, and the Smyrna Air Show.

We are thrilled to continue serving Southeast Nashville and the surrounding area by providing a high quality, supportive, personalized education to all students. Next year, we will welcome seventh graders as we again expand the number of students we serve. A permanent site for the NCP Upper School has been secured less than two miles from the current elementary site with a groundbreaking scheduled for June 8, 2023. We are excited for all the future holds for Nashville Collegiate Prep.
