



RESOLUTION OF THE TENNESSEE PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOL COMMISSION
REGARDING THE PURPOSE PREP ACADEMY AMENDMENT APPEAL

Whereas, pursuant to T.C.A. § 49-13-101 et. seq., Purpose Prep Academy Charter School ("PPA") submitted an appeal to the denial of its amendment petition by Metro Nashville Public Schools ("MNPS") dated December 3, 2021 to the Tennessee Public Charter School Commission ("Commission"), which is charged with serving as an appellate authorizer beginning with the 2020-2021 school year, and;

Whereas, representatives of the sponsor of PPA and MNPS participated in a public hearing on January 13, 2022 to answer questions of the Commission staff and receive comments from members of the public in the local district, and;

Whereas, the Commission, at the regularly scheduled meeting on January 28, 2022, reviewed, discussed, and considered the full appeal record, final statements of the parties, and the Executive Director's recommendation prior to voting on a decision, and;

Whereas, the Commission finds that approval of the amendment petition is in the best interest of the students, LEA, or community;

Therefore, be it resolved by the Tennessee Public Charter School Commission that the amendment petition for Purpose Prep Academy is approved, pursuant to T.C.A. § 49-13-110(d).

Commissioner Tucker moved for approval of the Resolution.
