I am Helena Pierce. My husband and I chose KIPP because we visited Thomas Edison Elementary in Antioch in 2018 and found some concerns.

They were 400+ students over capacity per the Principal. They were adding a Pre-K the next year, which would increase the overage of students.

School ranking dropped to a 2.5 or 2 that year, which is very low. When we moved into the area it was over a 3. Still not great, but the best we could afford to live near at the time.

We requested our daughter be Brigance tested due to her birth date being September 23, though the school agreed that said she was not ready for Kindergarten and offered Pre-K. The same test was done at KIPP Antioch. They admitted her to Kindergarten.

She has been at the top of her class ever since. She is in the third grade and thriving!!! Waiting an additional year would have resulted in a bored and disruptive child. At KIPP she is engaged and working at her full capability, despite being the youngest in her class.

It is because of the above that our second daughter will not wait to go to KIPP Antioch Elementary next year for Kindergarten. I can't imagine another parent facing the fear of overcrowding and low school rating, so we chose KIPP.
