In 1999 A&E listed the one hundred most influential people in the world over the last 1000 years. Interestingly, the top ten were all classically trained. I learned this fact when I was attending a Classical Conversations Practicum a few years ago, and I found it amazing that so many people who changed the world had a similar educational experience. Why is classical education making a comeback? What does it mean to be classical? Why did it ever go away? Should Maury County welcome the American Classical Education (ACE) charter school affiliated with Hillsdale College? Yes, Maury County should openly welcome an ACE charter school because struggling families need a reputable charter school, classical education has a proven track record that has stood the test of time, and the status quo is not working.

First of all, there is a great income disparity in Maury County. There are families that can afford the private school tuition of the several schools in the county, some can homeschool, and others do not have a choice but to send their children to public schools. The cost per pupil has been steadily rising with little to no effect on results. The definition of insanity is doing the same thing while expecting a different result. Not all students learn the same, and many don't fit in the one-size-fits-all box of public education. If a family is without financial means or the ability to homeschool, there is no other option but the public school. ACE charter schools are held to a higher standard and will not cost those families who choose it anything other than the taxes they are already paying. Maury County has been growing with a massive influx of people from out of state and will need new schools. An ACE charter school would be one way to address that growing need with a top-notch and proven education while serving families who cannot afford a private education or have the means to homeschool.

Although there are many ideas about what it means to be classical, there are some principles that most classical schools have in common. For example, most agree that the Trivium is a part of being classical. The Trivium works well with the developmental stages of children. First is the grammar stage, hence when we have all heard the term "grammar school." Children in this stage are excellent at memorizing information and love to repeat what they know in songs and rhymes. Next is the dialectic stage in which children start to understand and struggle with that knowledge, especially how to apply it. We can see this clearly with middle school-aged children who question everything and enjoy arguing. Finally, we see the third stage of rhetoric, which is the later high school years. Knowledge has been learned, understood, practiced, and debated. Now it's time to share, present, and teach based on that knowledge. Similarly, we all go through these stages of the Trivium whenever we learn something new, but developmentally, it makes sense to use the strengths of children at different stages to make the most of their learning.

Besides the Trivium, most classical schools teach logic and Latin. Are these courses outdated and no longer needed in our modern times? Absolutely not. Unfortunately, education has been dumbed down for years. The purpose of our present modern education was simply to produce workers for the industrial age, not people who are capable of thinking on their own and truly capable of evaluating ideas. The return to logic creates

children with strong minds who are not easily swayed by propaganda and manipulation. They are also much more capable of persuading others of their own ideas. Also, why Latin when it seems like a dead language? Unlike current spoken languages, Latin does not change. It makes up sixty percent of the English language, which also is helpful for students to decipher unfamiliar and more difficult English words. It is not "dead" as it is currently used frequently in science, medicine, law, and is a part of Christian church history. A Latin student will have a full understanding of the foundations of all languages, including his or her own.

Another reason classical education is superior is because it connects us to our past. Several classical programs and schools exist, and they all have in common that they use literature from the past-the classics. Modern education gives the false illusion that our current time is at the pinnacle of civilization, and that whatever came before is of no consequence and full of errors. Learning the classics of literature, students learn that the same or similar problems have always existed, despite differences in culture and time. We can see how our present-day time is connected to the past. Students can learn from the wisdom and mistakes of the past, applying it to the present time so we can clearly examine the errors of our own time. We've all seen the "man on the street" interviews that are so embarrassing when the average citizen doesn't know how to locate our own country on a map, cannot recite any continents, and doesn't know who fought in the American Revolution. The status quo is not working. Students are graduating unable to read, and those that can read cannot distinguish between propaganda and facts. Classical education has been proven to create better informed citizens. Most citizens today vote their feelings rather than voting based on knowledge of the candidates and the issues. Creating a better society starts with the education of the younger generations.

For all these reasons, Maury County should welcome an ACE charter school. It's a blessing that families would have an option that won't tax them financially. A classical education is a rigorous education that returns to teaching logic, Latin, and history, as well as making the most of the developmental stages with the Trivium. This is why classical education is making a comeback. It's proven to work. If we truly care about the children and the future of our community, as well as the future of our country, we as citizens of Maury County will gladly receive an ACE charter school.

To the Charter School Commission,

I am father of four young children and an upper school teacher at Agathos Classical School in Columbia TN. I also hold a masters in philosophy and moral psychology from the University of Tennessee in Knoxville.

I attended the school board meeting wherein our school board declined to accept American Classical Academy as a charter school in our county. I was disappointed in the decision, but I was much more disappointed in the utter lack of reasoning powers used in arriving at that decision. ??Reasons given in opposition to the charter school ranged from tertiary to contradictory:?

- 1. The main concerns offered by residents merely concerned bus routes and lunches. Other comments concerned the untrustworthiness of classical school outcomes, which were supported by no data and which contradict many reports to the contrary.?
- 2. Concerns voiced by school board member, Marlina Ervin, offered even less in substance. She argued that somehow she was in favor of school choice, but only choices that involved attending public schools (a clear contradiction). She went on to acknowledge that our public schools are underperforming, but that we should pity our public school teachers because their classrooms have too many students. In this she unknowingly supported the charter school since it would aid in reducing class sizes and so, by her reasoning, improve the performance of public schools.??

The reasons were painfully inadequate, but somehow they were enough to convince the majority of our board members. I could only take such poor reasoning as evidence for one or two conclusions:

For one, their lack of reasoning powers may be evidence of a very deep problem, that our school system is run by educators who do not know how to think. This would explain why our public school students are severely underperforming.

Another possibility is that those in opposition were not serious about their reasons, but, rather, are hiding something. Perhaps they do not 'actually' want fewer students in classrooms because that would lower school funding. Perhaps they are worried that a strong, competitive alternative will further put their competence into question. Or, perhaps, they are worried that teacher unions will lose power over our teachers and students.?

Whatever, the reason, I could find no favorable light to shine our board. Their decision was at best nearsighted and, at worst, self-serving.

?As a classical school teacher in Maury County, I have seen the power of classical education. Our students are hardworking, socially mature and strong critical thinkers. Our students have a strong sense of identity and go on to success in a wide range of disciplines. Whether trade school, bible college, or top tier universities, they do so with confidence and without looking down on one option or another. For those that attend universities, they are typically invited to special weekends exclusive to classical

students because those in higher education know that classical students boast higher retention and performance.?? Moreover, many reports show the power of classical schools. For one, the Good Soil Report, which was independently conducted by Notre Dame and is available online for viewing, concluded that those from American Classical Christian Schools, in comparison to homeschooling, public and other private options report:?

- 1. The strongest sense of thankfulness and confidence dealing with life problems.
- 2. The strongest sense of preparedness for college
- 3. The highest grade performance in college
- 4. The strongest participation in churches as well as other organizations, specifically, those focused on helping the poor and needy.

All of this, including my own experience that affirms these statistics, suggest that welcoming similar classical school opportunities is a win for our city and families like mine who would like strong options when considering education for each of our children. Doubtless, the burden of proof strongly falls on those who would dismiss this opportunity in our city, where a small school like Agathos (where I teach) could not possibly meet the need.??

So, with all due respect, in voting to accept or deny this Charter School proposal the commission has one of two options. It may accept the the charter school, offering greater school choice and 'a greater' school choice than what is currently available in our city. And, in doing so, it may push back against the very tides of poor thinking evident in our community. Or, to the contrary, it may join in a chorus of noises railing against this charter school option, either for utter lack of reasoning, or, more likely, for hidden motives that are too shameful to be spoken out loud.??

I hope this commission will make the best decision for our city. Thank you.

Written Comment

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the proposal in support of Maury County Schools.

Academic Progress Measures (Tennessee Value-Added Assessment System, TVAAS): The proposed ACAM will initially serve grades K-5. Maury County TVAAS results for school-subject-grade combinations for grades 4 & 5 in 2022 show 34% at or above the state growth standard & 66% below. However, in 2023, that same progress measure shows 47% at or above the state growth standard and 52% below, a significant improvement despite the lingering effects of a pandemic. In addition, our teachers had to contend with the frustration over an inappropriate 3rd grade promotion policy that Maury County educators did not choose, and a change in District Director leadership midyear. Even in the face of all of these circumstances, Maury County educators made significant progress in a positive direction. As stated, the goal of the American Classical Academy Maury (ACAM) is to initially perform at the state average in progress, but we have no data from other American Classical Education (ACE) schools in this state to allow comparison.

Transportation: Maury County ranks 10th in geographical area in the state and no public transportation system exists. ACAM hopes to make transportation a parental responsibility. Given the size of this county, the number of working parents in jobs that are inflexible in scheduling, and the number of single parents lacking a support system to provide transportation, I believe this proposal lacks sufficient specificity to ensure that transportation will not become a limiting factor in school enrollment. The difficulties of finding a sufficient number of licensed school bus drivers in Maury and surrounding counties underscore my concerns that the ACAM proposal inadequately addresses this challenge.

School Fees: In the Handbook for Parents, the principal's letter discloses that students will be charged fees for certain activities, etc. Although enrolled students are not required to participate in the extracurricular activities to meet school academic requirements, the fees have the potential for creating a division of "haves" and "have nots" which is not in keeping with the school community the ACAM aspires to offer. Further, students who are delinquent in their fees will have their grades or diplomas withheld, thereby making transfer to another school or getting a job after graduation more complicated than necessary. The ACAM proposal lacks a sustainable solution for funding beyond the use of state and federal money available and what I assume to be "one time" grant money. An absence of extracurricular opportunity for all students weakens the application and thus it weakens the assurances that the school will offer a meaningful choice to Maury County students.

Professional Development: Informed by my school reform evaluation experiences, I understand that successful reform requires adequate engaging and ongoing professional development to ensure the fidelity of the reform effort. For such an extreme makeover that I see in the

approaches in math, reading and language, science and history, I am concerned that the application proposes insufficient professional development delivery for that to occur. Particularly in the early years when the school is recruiting teachers, an inconsistent professional development delivery would expose ACAM students to risks in academic progress not necessarily experienced by students enrolled in traditional Maury County Schools. Research shows that students who systematically experience insufficient academic progress year to year will require specific and ongoing academic intervention if they are to achieve their full academic potential by graduation. Students simply do not bridge that gap by happenstance. I did not find interventions for this purpose addressed in the application. Unless ACAM has a specific plan to address how their schooling ineffectiveness might affects students' ultimate achievement, it is very possible that the students would have fared better academically in the traditional Maury County Schools.

History Curriculum: Admittedly, Dr. Larry Arnn's negative labeling of both teachers and colleges of education as "stupid" was offensive to me, and his opinions do not reflect the norm of my professional experiences, both in Tennessee and in districts in other states. However, my disappointment in the history curriculum stems, not from the news coverage of the Hillsdale History Curriculum, but from my personal review of the unit plans provided and from accessing The Great American Story online. Primarily, I chose to look at the elementary curriculum because those grades are the first to be offered.

To put my concerns in context, I am providing a little background: I attended segregated schools through twelfth grade and entered MTSU in 1965, the first year African American students were allowed to enroll. During my high school and college years, I watched with horror on the nightly news the cruelty inflicted on African Americans simply because they wanted the equal protection under the law the U.S. Constitution affords all of us in theory and some of us in truth. Although sympathetic to the horrors, I also developed an unfounded fear of African Americans that was encouraged by my segregated world and our country's failure to provide equal protection under our law. Because, I am a strong proponent of using source documents such as the personal stories of members of the Civil Rights movement of the 1960s, last summer I invited my sixteen year old grandson to accompany me on a Justice Journey into Alabama. That trip was facilitated by the Columbia Peace and Justice Initiative, and we were privileged to hear elderly voices from the past telling us their stories in Birmingham, Selma, Montgomery, and Tuskegee. I strongly believe their story is a vital part of "the great American story," and we should not allow it to be minimized or denied by the history we teach.

Therefore, I take great issue with the ACAM history curriculum because of the missing candor I had hoped to find. It is not enough to "welcome diversity" at any school in this county without an accompanying tone and the tenor of the curricular content and the enrichment resources available

for both teachers and students that is both truthful and complete. For example, I do not think we can talk about "African American colonists" without discussing that their "colonization" resulted from kidnapping, since they did not choose to settle in this country. I find a simple comparison of the "harsh conditions suffered by indentured servants" to that of enslaved African Americans to be both offensive and incomplete. In the text I reviewed, I saw no candid admission that most but not all "indentured servants" chose to colonize this country while African American slaves did not. Additionally, the indentured servants' children did not become the personal property of their masters. The class discussion about how slavery "dehumanizes both masters and slaves" suggests "wrongs" were suffered by both and that they are somehow to be equated on a mysterious scale of justice is not only wrong but inappropriate for elementary grades. And to attempt, even in part, to justify the system of slavery by concluding that slaves benefited from the system because they learned trades is incomprehensible for me.

I seriously question that early grades ACAM teachers, using the resources I reviewed, can quickly develop the sensitivity to facilitate appropriate class discussion without inflicting psychological damage on our African American students. I further see they are more likely to reinforce for Caucasian students that we shouldn't worry about a system of slavery in colonial America because it was a common practice in other countries at the time. Consequently, I view the K-12 history curriculum to be one of the most serious flaws in the proposal.

In conclusion, I've fought for equity in educational opportunity for students for my entire educational career, beginning in the 1990s when my local district joined the Small Schools lawsuit against the State to access equitable funding, and continuing through my research work to find the accelerators and impediments of student academic progress within a school setting. More than once during my career, my work responsibilities have taken me to effective charter schools, so I know they could exist. But I do not believe the ACAM charter as described in the proposal will meet that level of effectiveness. However, it could, in the short term, even lessen educational opportunity for the students who enroll. Taking into consideration the improvement of Maury County Public Schools in 2023 as evidenced by their TVAAS results, the difficulties of providing transportation in a county this size where there is essentially no public transportation, the conundrum of "haves" and "have nots" the school fees are likely to exacerbate, the complexity of maintaining fidelity to the proposed curricula with sufficient professional development, and my grave concerns of how this history curriculum could do more to alienate than heal our community, I respectfully request the TN Public Charter Schools Commission to uphold the decision of the Maury County Board of Education and deny the ACAM appeal.

I cannot speak strongly enough against the American Classical Academy opening a school and receiving funding in Maury County. I am the parent of an honors and multi-sport student in Maury County Public Schools, and he has always been in the Maury County Public School System. I am also an active volunteer in this school system and a former coach for the Maury County School System. The curriculum and opportunities are varied and vast and afford him and others the opportunity to learn and develop to the best of their individual capabilities. Like any school system, a lot of student success does and should fall on the parents to reinforce lessons at home and drive students to put their personal best foot forward. What Maury County and most school systems need to better themselves is funding for teachers and programs that offer student enrichment and enhancement as well as education.

I have researched American Classical Academy and their curriculum and core values. I have several concerns about them coming to Maury County. First is their limited curriculum and focus on teaching students "morals", which is laced and repeated throughout their website. Those are lessons that are particular to the person or family and shouldn't be the driving force of an educational institution receiving State funds. Their wording also tap dances all over the separation between church and state with its focus on Christian ways, which is alienating to many in Maury County, across the state, and Country. In addition, their curriculum is narrow and requires all students to take Latin, which is a dead language to the degree that Universities in this and many states do not even acknowledge it as meeting foreign language requirements, meaning those students would start all over with foreign language in college, putting them behind rather than ahead of their peers.

Of even more importance is the fact the American Classical Academy appears to cherry pick their students, selecting those that have higher performance and testing capabilities rather than affording opportunities to an equal number of students with educational/intellectual deficiencies or delays. High performers equal dollars, and that is the bottom line for American Classical School as they are profit driven. Similarly, Maury County is a very diverse area, with many students who are not native English speakers. American Classical Academy does not cater or afford an equal opportunity to more than a few of those students in any of their locations.

Of great weight and importance is the use of State funds to pay for a Charter school. When the American Classical Academy pulls high performers to their "school" the funding associated with the student numbers and performance based dollars goes with them. Written Comment

I cannot speak strongly enough against the American Classical Academy opening a school and receiving funding in Maury County. I am the parent of an honors and multi-sport student in Maury County Public Schools, and he has always been in the Maury County Public School System. I am also an active volunteer in this school system and a former coach for the Maury County School System. The curriculum and opportunities are varied and vast and afford him and others the opportunity to learn and develop to the best of their individual capabilities. Like any school system, a lot of student success does and should fall on the parents to reinforce lessons at home and drive students to put their personal best foot forward. What Maury County and most school systems need to better themselves is funding for teachers and programs that offer student enrichment and enhancement as well as education.

I have researched American Classical Academy and their curriculum and core values. I have several concerns about them coming to Maury County. First is their limited curriculum and focus on teaching students "morals", which is laced and repeated throughout their website. Those are lessons that are particular to the person or family and shouldn't be the driving force of an educational institution receiving State funds. Their wording also tap dances all over the separation between church and state with its focus on Christian ways, which is alienating to many in Maury County, across the state, and Country. In addition, their curriculum is narrow and requires all students to take Latin, which is a dead language to the degree that Universities in this and many states do not even acknowledge it as meeting foreign language requirements, meaning those students would start all over with foreign language in college, putting them behind rather than ahead of their peers.

Of even more importance is the fact the American Classical Academy appears to cherry pick their students, selecting those that have higher performance and testing capabilities rather than affording opportunities to an equal number of students with educational/intellectual deficiencies or delays. High performers equal dollars, and that is the bottom line for American Classical School as they are profit driven. Similarly, Maury County is a very diverse area, with many students who are not native English speakers. American Classical Academy does not cater or afford an equal opportunity to more than a few of those students in any of their locations.

Of great weight and importance is the use of State funds to pay for a Charter school. When the American Classical Academy pulls high performers to their "school" the funding associated with the student numbers and performance based dollars goes with them. If those students misbehave or fail to perform, they could be sent back to the public school system at any time, be that a day, week, month, or many months. The funding associated with that student and their performance stay with American Classical Academy for that school year rather than filtering back to Maury County Public Schools.

Lastly, I am confused as to why we, as a school district, parents, and community continue to have to speak out against the American Classical Academy. The proposal was submitted to the County, the Board had subject matter experts review and score the proposal and it failed, not once, but twice. This appeal and hearing appear to be the political machinations of a select few on the Board, spearheaded by Commissioner Gabe Howard in furtherance of his efforts to sabotage and undermine our Director of Schools. It is my hope and that of the majority of Maury County, that this appeal will not succeed and that the people's voices will be heardwe do not want, welcome, or need American Classical Academy in Maury County. The supporting arguments for the addition of the ACE Charter School to the Maury County School System have been made time and again throughout this process, so for the sake of brevity, I will point to the two main reasons why I believe the ACE Charter School should be authorized in Maury County:

In the first, it is no secret to any resident of Maury County that the County's finances are taking a massive hit due to unprecedented growth in the area. The County's budget is being strained by the necessitated infrastructure costs that come with the growth, and that is after some residents' property taxes were doubled last year. The inclusion of the ACE Charter School in our County saves the County government \$55 million in the building alone, as ACE would pay for all capital projects. From there, I believe that administrators working for ACE will be far more incentivized to be frugal and efficient with their spending than government administrators in similar positions. The savings to the County that the inclusion of ACE offers will go far in building trust and appreciation in the community.

Most importantly, the inclusion of ACE brings an alternative to traditional educational systems that parents in Maury County deserve. Our school system is failing our students, with test scores consistently showing that only 30% of students are reading and understanding math at a grade level. This is despite many increases in spending on the part of the school system. These consistently poor results are occurring despite regular budget increases for the school system in the last decade alone. The system as it currently stands is not working. The inclusion of ACE into the school system at minimum provides an alternative for parents to choose for their children, something that many studies show will likely increase their academic performance. With standardized scores consistently remaining as low as they are, it is a low bar to begin with. At least offering an alternative to parents gives them an opportunity to improve their child's education. After considering the performance history of charter schools in general, and classical education in particular, I believe that ACE will not only provide this opportunity, it will dramatically increase academic performance for students that are able to attend.

Written Comment

Intro:

I would like to offer a lens for discerning arguments against the charter school. My focus is not on those with ill intent, but, rather, I intend to remain as charitable as possible towards those with genuinely decent and loving intentions, even if those intentions are misguided.

Comments:

I take it that the heart of the issue concerns two opposing views about the obligation schools have toward prospective students. On the one hand, there are those who believe that the obligation of a school is to craft an excellent opportunity and serve anyone who is willing to take it, regardless of race, gender, or class. Those in favor of this view believe, "greatness can arise from anywhere." And, simply put, this how any successful organization must develop: Beginning with an excellent product, then reaching a core clientele who are willing to try it, and, finally, spreading the word to others.

There are, however, others who take a different view. They hold that the obligation of a school is not so much to craft an excellent learning opportunity, but, much more importantly, to provide equal access for an educational opportunity. Hence it is their job to ensure that greatness equally arises from all its possible sources and against all possible reasons it might be made unequal.

As such they extend the purpose of education to that of restructuring the world outside school walls, but, ultimately, when they discover that they cannot, they sacrifice their product on that very alter by lowering standards for underperforming or disinterested students. In contrast to those providing an excellent learning opportunity, their focus is, first, toward reaching the most unlikely students and, only second, toward creating an excellent product or reaching those most interested. In effect, they turn the most common sense model for organizational growth on its head. As such, the view is nearsighted, failing to appreciate the very high challenge of providing a good education for students. So, although, they stand proud for stressing the importance of "social class mobility" they do so by simply eroding the opportunity itself or by preventing new, promising opportunities on the basis that they are not directed at the most unlikely students. In doing so, they believe that a win for a decently performing student equates to a loss for some disadvantaged student. Hence, opportunities cannot be constructed for "anyone willing to take it," but must be aimed at the most disinterested and challenged student. The strategy has proved nothing more than a means to fail the advantaged and disadvantaged alike.

This may sound outlandish, but much less in view of the basic evidence of our case. Maury County public schools are underperforming as evidenced by numerous statistics and headlines. The Classical Charter School we are debating provides a strong, tested methodology and Classical schools are sorely outperforming public schools. Yet, somehow the charter school has been struck down. On what basis? It is not on the basis of its product, but apparently - on the basis that such a school would not be a good fit for some difficult-to-reach student.

Hence, those in opposition spend time on lengthy arguments about transportation or lunches not being adequate for some student or another. That is, they seem committed to rejecting any educational opportunity that cannot guarantee equal representation and equal access for every disadvantaged student. Even if well-intended, it is an impossible criteria to satisfy.

As i've explained, any organization that does not wish to sacrifice its product on the alter of equal access, would be wise to focus on the clientele who care most about its product first, and then increasingly extend its reach to others who are less interested or most difficult to reach. That this charter school is unable to serve some students in some unique situation is no reason to denounce a school that, much more importantly, will provide a unique, high-level classical opportunity to many disadvantaged students who would otherwise never have the chance. Worse, continuing down our current path by failing to provide excellent educational opportunities will stunt the growth of our city. If our schools are unattractive to outsiders and we fail to develop our next generation of leaders, workers and entrepreneurs, then our economy suffer, resulting in more disadvantaged students.

In conclusion, there is something to appreciate in those with a heart for equal access. It is for the marginalized and the least likely to succeed. It is a view that supports those most in need of help, care and love. It is a hard reality. Why should I support the charter school, when I know a student who won't attend?

My response is two fold. first, as I have explained, to build a great city, our schools must focus, first and foremost, on providing an excellent service to anyone that will take it. The Charter School in question provides an excellent one and it should not be condemned for refusing to lose focus and chase remaking the world outside its walls or sacrificing their product to that end.

And, second, because the opportunity is open to anyone, we as individual citizens have a higher calling to personally fight for those who need it most: To convince them of the very good opportunities in front of them, to arrange support where needed.

The "Equal Access" view, however, is a deconstructionist strategy for excellence. It lowers schools to the students, rather than raising students to toward excellence. And for that reason it is not a viable option nor are arguments based from it, reasonable for denouncing the charter school.

Dear Commissioners:

I write in opposition to the American Classical Academy Maury (ACAM) application and write today in support of the denial of that application by the Maury County Board of Education (a/k/a Maury County Public Schools or MCPS).

I reside at 1608 Mary Ct in Columbia. I own approximately 1/3rd of an acre of property where I live full-time. I am a voter and taxpayer at this location. I do not have children of my own, but I have a strong desire to protect and improve the quality of our public schools. First, I have in the past had roommates with children who attended Maury County schools (particularly J. E. Woodard Elementary School). Furthermore, I am a children's program volunteer at Grace Episcopal Church in Spring Hill, and occasionally for Craft Memorial Methodist Church in Columbia, and in this role am one of several adults responsible for the supervision and Christian education of these children. I am a member of the Kiwanis Club of Columbia, whose mission is to assist with public education, and I have volunteered to help park cars at many football games at Columbia Central High School. I have many friends with children in the public schools in this county. As chairman of the Maury County Democratic Party is my responsibility to talk to Democrats and to understand how policy affects their families. Finally, I am a candidate for Tennessee State Senate in SD 28.

My comments are my own, and I am not speaking in a paid representative capacity.

I wish to supplement my oral comments (an approximate transcript of which is also attached below) with these written comments.

I. Areas of deficiency in the application of American Classical Academy Maury

The initial charter school application submitted by ACAM was reviewed in the spring of 2023 by the Charter Application Review Team (CART) assembled by the administration of the Maury County Public Schools. During this review, the CART found the ACAM application to "partially meet standards" in all three broad categories -- academics, operations, and finances. Furthermore, the MCPS CART found the application deficient (partially or fully failing to meet standards) in 22 of the 27 applicable subcategories.

Based on this, the Maury County Board of Education twice denied ACAM's application. Although the objections raised by the School Board members do not explicitly incorporate all of the deficiencies raised by the MCPS CART review, in my opinion, the Commission should carefully review the record with regard to all 22 subcategories where the CART found deficiencies.

Moreover, the Commission should carefully review the responses provided by ACAM to the objections of the MCPS Board members.

Because the Public Charter School Commission is conducting a de novo review on the record, the PCSC is entitled to come to its own conclusions as to whether ACAM's application meets or exceeds the state quality rubric. Moreover, the presence or absence of a "proper" process on the part of MCPS is really of no relevance to this Commission's own review.

The areas of deficiency that most concern me are as follows:

A. Enrollment (standard 1.2). While there are certainly at least a few parents in Maury County who are interested in sending their children to an ACAM school, the actual level of interest will depend heavily on location, which is not yet known.

Maury County has a serious traffic problem during morning and evening commutes; it is not unusual for it to take longer to get from the south side of Columbia to Spring Hill in the morning than it does to get from Spring Hill to downtown Nashville. This is because we have had rapid development, but our infrastructure has not kept up. Without a clear transportation plan (also lacking) many families with two working parents will not be able to reliably provide transportation.

While Mr. Schwenk has stated that he has spoken to many parents, there does not appear to have been a systematic survey of Maury County parents about the market demand for ACAM. This was a particular concern raised by the MCPS Board members.

- B. Alignment (standard 1.3, 1.4, 2.11) -- While the application insists that the curriculum will align with state standards, ACAM is also asking for waivers related to this, for example about unauthorized textbooks (TCA 49-6-2206). On a rather interesting note, in its responses, it states that the waiver won't be needed if Tennessee changes its state standards to align with a classical model. This seems a bit like the tail wagging the dog! In any case, this standard needs particular attention because it seems that ACAM is trying to take a "have your cake and eat it too" approach.
- C. Special Populations (standards 1.9, 1.10, 1.11, and 1.12). I am particularly concerned about this area, where the MCPS CART concluded that the ACAM application did not meet the state standard. IEPs are extremely important to our families and services will be needed to execute those plans. As someone who received speech therapy as a child, I feel that the provision of such services is very important. While the ACAM application mentions that what about other services?

Accommodating students experiencing homelessness will also matter tremendously; as a former substitute teacher in Texas, I saw how housing instability affected students after Hurricane Ike hit the Houston, Texas area

in 2008. The MCPS Cart was particularly concerned about such students.

Will the state charter school district be able to help provide these resources if ACAM fails to do so? The concern that ACAM might drain MCPS district resources is stated in the MCPS CART review as one reason why ACAM's application fails to meet standard 1.9.

The comments by MCPS CART for standards 1.10 - 1.12 also paint a picture of an application for a school that will be focused on broad messaging rather than the narrow needs of parents and students.

D. Diversity (various standards). In addition to the items mentioned above, there is the broader issue of diversity, in all dimensions (ethnic, religious, social, cultural, etc.). This is an area where there seems to be a significant disconnect between ACAM's marketing material (which, notably, featured many stock photos of people of color) and advocates (Cf. Rep. Cepicky's comment that black students are trapped in "failing" schools) and the actual substance of their application and responses.

In one particularly odd paragraph, the ACAM response with a concern about the intersection of diversity and transportation capacity (Response #E), ACAM defensively criticizes "stereotypes" but fails to back up that pooh-poohing with facts demonstrating that working families have the ability to provide their transportation. Remarkably, ACAM seems to be asking us to prefer ignorance over (what are, frankly, reasonable) assumptions. I humbly submit that such an answer would have -- correctly! -- been blasted as "woke" nonsense if it had been written by someone coming from the political left. For actual facts on this issue, see Bureau of Transportation Statistics, "A Longer Router to School", January 12, 2021, online at https://www.bts.gov/topics/passenger-travel/back-school-2019 (providing government statistics demonstrating that poor families have less access to transportation and that school buses are necessary for educational equity).

The Commission needs to pay attention to this. Classical charter schools have occasionally been in the news for controversies that undermine their ability to effectively educate children from diverse backgrounds. For example, see:

(noting Hillsdale-affiliated Tallahassee Classical School was dropped by Hillsdale after a group of parents got the principal fired over the display of a picture over the renowned Statue of David by Michelangelo, on the frivolous claim that it was "pornographic").

- E. Start-Up Plan (standard 2.2) -- It is agreed by everyone that the 2024 start date proposed in the ACAM application is unrealistic. There appears to be a de facto amendment that the start-up date is likely to be 2025-26, at best. When interviewing the applicant, the Commission should inquire as to what plans ACAM will make to ensure that this schedule is realistic.
- F. Facilities (standard 2.3) -- The location is unknown. The MCPS Cart commented that the proposed facility size may not even be correct. There are numerous unknowns here that will not only affect the quality of the school but its budget. It has been claimed by ACAM advocates that the school will be "free" but all budgets are purely speculative until a site determination is made.
- G. Transportation (standard 2.7) -- See all my previous comments under points A and F. As sort of a fig leaf, ACAM proposes \$120,000 be used to help parents, but until the other issues are figured out it is unclear whether this budget is sufficient.
- H. Nutrition (standard 2.8) -- This was an area of concern for MCPS Board members. The Commission should not simply assume that ACAM will meet all regulatory standards just because it makes a vague promise to do so.
- I. Waivers (standard 2.11) -- ACAM has asked for 16 waivers. At the initial MCPS Board meeting in April, Mr. Schwenk told MCPS Board members that the waivers were boilerplate. The MCPS Board did not find this to be persuasive, and asked for further clarification, particularly as to why they were needed. Many of the responses by ACAM were either detached from student performance (for example related to career ladders) or made vague claims about being necessary to implement a classical model. While other schools have asked for more waivers, the Commission should look at every one of these waivers to determine if they have been properly justified according to state standard 2.11.

II. Responses to other speakers

As the first speaker at the hearing on Thursday, September 21st, I had only a limited ability to respond to the claims raised by other speakers. I will briefly summarize my responses here.

Mr. Chad Howell, a former police officer and school board member, spoke in opposition to the application and in support of MCPS. He noted that a new state law (Pub. Ch. No. 0367, formerly HB0322, effective July 1, 2023) requires public charter schools to have school resource officers (SROs)

and security plans and systems. Failure to implement this will result in state funding to the charter school being withheld. ACAM's ability to comply with the statute directly implicates several quality standards (such as those relating to facilities, transportation, the start-up plan, personnel, and financial management). ACAM probably can comply with this law, and one of their Board members (Jeff Hicks) has domain knowledge. With that said, however, it is my opinion that the changes made by Pub Ch. No. 0367 are significant enough and impacts so many different aspects of the school's operation that the application should be resubmitted.

Mr. Greg Hanners, speaking in opposition to the ACAM application and in support of MCPS, noted that since all parties seem to agree that the school will not be ready before 2025, it would be better to deny the application and see whether American Classical Schools can produce quality results in Rutherford County, where their application was approved. I completely concur with my friend Mr. Hanners, and once again state that the application should be denied and ACAM should submit a better application later.

Denial and re-application would also allay concerns that MCPS Board Chair Michael Fulbright erred by agreeing to allow ACAM to submit responses to objections rather than to submit a fully amended application, as the public charter school statute seems to require (see Tenn. Code sec. 49-13-108(b)(3)).

I am also in agreement with the comments made by Mr. Seth Campbell, Dr. Christa S. Martin, Ms. Jacque Lightfoot Marshall, and Mr. Jim York.

Two speakers supporting the ACAM application raised process arguments. As noted above, these are not particularly relevant to this application, because this is a de novo review, and the Public Charter School Commission has the independent ability to approve or deny regardless of what errors were made at the MCPS Board level.

MCPS Board member Laura Nutt particularly raised a grievance regarding the alleged "plagiarism" of the school district and consultation with other districts. I entirely disagree with Ms. Nutt's characterization. Given the novel nature of this application, it would have been irresponsible if MCPS failed to consult closely with the school boards in other counties. Because the Rutherford County school board came to a different conclusion on ACAM's application, I do not see how anyone can claim with a straight face that MCPS's discussions with other counties prejudiced the CART against ACAM. Despite this, spurious claims of "plagiarism" have been made against the dedicated public servants of Maury County by supporters of ACAM, including Ms. Nutt, who as a Board member should have more respect for the school system. It is unfortunate that the supporters of the application find it necessary to engage in ad hominem attacks rather than refute the points raised by the CART.

Ms. Sue Stephenson, a former county commissioner who I respect tremendously, further raised the objection (if I recall correctly) that the MCPS Board resolution states that the ACAM charter school would have significant negative impacts on the district's finances and that this was improper because the issue was not discussed in a meeting. If Ms. Stephenson wants to allege a violation of the Open Meetings Act, she is entitled to do so, although to my recollection she did not claim this. I would defend MCPS by saying that I think a statement about financial impact is so obvious as to not really require much discussion; approval of the school would (under the new TISA finance law,) mean transferring funds away from struggling unit schools like we have in Culleoka and Santa Fe and Hampshire and send it to the new public charter school. Whether this shift is a trickle or a tide, depends on your view of ACAM's enrollment projections. But the fundamental issue I want to make -- aside from the fact that Ms. Stephenson's objection is irrelevant, again because this Commission is conducting a de novo review -- is that it is spurious because a reasonable drafter could insert this as a matter of course.

Multiple speakers supporting the ACAM application made claims that, frankly, do not belong before this Commission. Many of the speakers (including Rep. Scott Cepicky, Mayor Sheila Butt, and others) made general comments about classical education and charter schools that are essentially moral arguments to be pitched to a legislative body in favor of more charter school spending or adopting classical education models in the public schools. They are not, however, relevant to the quality of ACAM's application, which is the primary issue this Commission is responsible for.

The appeals scheme described in the Tennessee Public Charter Schools Act makes it clear that the Public Charter School Commission is primarily an adjudicative, not a legislative, entity. This Commission has no more business making its decision on "charter schools are good/bad" type arguments than a circuit court would have to find a criminal defendant guilty of murder solely on the basis that "killing is wrong," without more specific evidence of that defendant's actual guilt.

As I noted in oral comments, state law (Tenn. Code 49-13-108(b)(5)(D) requires an application be approved or rejected based on a combination of two factors --

- 1) "[whether] the commission finds that the application meets or exceeds the metrics outlined in the department of education's application-scoring rubric"
- -- and --
- 2) "[whether] approval of the application is in the best interests of the students, LEA, or community."

In the case that both criteria are met, this Commission *may* grant

approval to the application. Note that in statutory construction the word "may" is generally meant to imply discretion, i.e. that approval is not mandatory even if both criteria are met (see, e.g. Tenn. Code sec. 6-1-102).

The applicant, ACAM, has asked this Commission to give disproportionate weight to the second factor, and the comments of the speakers supporting ACAM play heavily to this. However, both are required. Moreover, I would emphasize again (as I did in the oral comment) that a failure to provide a quality application jeopardizes the purported benefits that the applicant is claiming. As Mr. Howell noted, if this application were a business plan, the applicant would have trouble getting bank funding; the reason for this is that banks generally expect lenders to pay back their debts. If the Commission were to be in the habit of lending credence to applicants -- no matter how fabulous their "magic beans" sound -- without an expectation for repayment, then it is not acting in the best interests of the State of Tennessee.

Regarding the concern raised by Dr. Garrett, and suggested by Rep. Cepicky, that this school is necessary to ensure that people of color and working families can access classical education, I would again emphasize that the benefits are contingent upon quality. I would furthermore note that the outcome for minority and economically disadvantaged families is particularly contingent upon the school having solid plans in place for enrolling children from diverse backgrounds, ensuring that services and disciplinary policies are written and enforced equitably, as well as a plan for recruiting teachers from diverse backgrounds. Policies related to diversity were a particular area of concern that was raised by the MCPS Board in denying the application.

Moreover, the speculated site for the ACAM school -- "north of Columbia" -- is an affluent part of our county, and how far north of Columbia one goes is going to be a significant factor as to how much benefit this school might have for disadvantaged households.

It was also noted by Rep. Cepicky that our TCAP scores in Maury County were subpar. I do not believe I need to remind this Commission that the TCAP test has been criticized repeatedly as having a faulty methodology. Nevertheless, the bigger issue about the ACAM application is that the school may serve, at a maximum, about 340 students. This would constitute about 2.5 percent of the MCPS student population. Even if ACAM has TCAP scores 20 points higher than the rest of the school district, it would only mean an increase of 1/2 of one percent in the districtwide TCAP passage rate. In real terms, perhaps five third-grade students would not be required to attend summer school before being promoted to the fourth grade. While that may be incredibly consequential to those five children, approving charter schools seems to be a "boil the oceans" approach to increasing test scores; similar results could likely be had at significantly less cost.

It was claimed by a speaker (I believe Commissioner Aaron Miller) that the school would be "free" and would help to offset the cost of school construction elsewhere. While construction may (or may not) be fully paid for, ongoing facilities maintenance and the cost of operating the school are not, and those have been estimated around \$7 million per year if the school were at full capacity. The ACAM application makes it clear that the proposed school will be dependent on federal and state funds. While TISA spending should bring millions more to Maury County, these funds are desperately needed to keep schools from closing; MCPS recently closed McDowell Elementary School in Columbia due to a lack of funding and has deferred building a much-needed school in Spring Hill. Again, such arguments are legislative in nature and outside the purview of the Public Charter School Commission.

III. My Oral Comments

These are my prepared remarks for the September 21st hearing, with some edits to conform them to what I said:

My name is James Dallas. I am a resident and homeowner in Maury County District 4. I serve as Chairman of the Maury County Democratic Party.

While I am open-minded on school choice, I oppose the American Classical Academy Maury application because it does not meet state quality guidelines, nor is it in the public interest.

[I noted in an off-the-cuff remark that the quality of ACAM's application would directly affect its ability to provide the promised benefits, so weight must be given to the quality of the application.]

As others will point out, there are numerous deficiencies with ACAM's application and responses. I will cover these in written comments, but today have these three observations:

- First, ACAM compares their application to that of KIPP Nashville, which this Commission upheld last year. There are several problems with this comparison. First, KIPP has a proven track record in operating schools, whereas ACAM has none. Second, KIPP had actual facilities they could fall back on, ACAM has none. Third, the KIPP school can rely on Metro services, such as WeGo public transit, that do not exist in Maury County.
- Second, the application gives ambiguous responses on transportation and food services. In one response they deny the need for a transportation plan but elsewhere imply providing transportation will allow them to meet other goals, such as enrollment and diversity. Let's be clear: the "who" and "how" are important to working families in Maury County!

Third, in the section relating to waivers, some of their justifications have nothing to do with student success - for example, they don't want career ladders because they don't want to budget for them - and other times make vague statements about the classical school model requiring the state law be ignored.

Frankly, my biggest concern about this application is that it is for a school to be built to fit a model, rather than the model being built for the school and its students. I have serious concerns that these deep ideological commitments will hinder improvements in the school's policies and curricula. For these reasons, I ask you to deny the appeal.

Thank you.

IV. Conclusion

For the reasons stated above, I ask that the Commission deny the appeal of American Classical Academy Maury.

I am the Board member from District 5 that talked during public comments.

The day after the first vote to deny ACAM, we received an email from them voicing concern regarding the review committee's evaluation. First, between the time the review was posted on Friday (5 days prior to the vote) to the Tuesday vote there had been significant changes made. I can verify this, as I had printed off the review on Saturday. Someone between Sunday and Tuesday went in and made changes. The original was identical to Clarksville-Montgomery and Rutherford's review evaluations. It even referenced Rutherford.

I also noticed discrepancies between MCPS rubric and the evaluation; one section of the rubric said it did meet standards, but the review posted said that section did not. There was also an entire section removed. In response to the email, Mrs. Ventura admitted to collaborating with the other counties. This was never stated to the Board as part of the process. Because of this, Chairman Fulbright requested that Board members who voted to deny submit their reasons and consents as part of the denial letter, setting aside the Review Evaluation.

The Charter School was told to submit answers for these concerns in lieu of the amended application.

The response from ACAM was what we were to vote on at the second meeting on July 27. Although we had a quorum, 2 members, Mr. Lindsey and Mr. Sims were not present. The Chairman decided to go ahead with the vote. The vote to approve failed, however we were informed by our attorney that we needed to vote to deny or the application would automatically be approved. Some members didn't think it would be " fair" to vote without the 2 other members, so the Chairman scheduled a 3rd vote. It was at this meeting that the application was denied.

The lawyer had a resolution already typed up for the denial letter, that claimed the reason to be fiscal, which was never even discussed. We did not vote on it because we were told we didn't have to.

I believe this whole process was unprofessional and possibly in violation of regulations. My review of the application found that ACAM did meet all State Standards required by Tennessee. This of course has a socio-economic element to it; the status quo ensures that alternate educational options are more available to those who can afford to pay private school tuition or have one parent stay home to teach their child. American Classical Academy's proposal would be one remedy to this unfortunate dilemma for many parents in Maury County. Public funds should follow students. Esther Lee Davenport Culleoka, TN 38401 At their July 27, 2023 meeting, the Maury County School Board voted 6-5 against the American Classical Academy application, and then the school attorney passed out a resolution of denial that he prepared in advance for the School Board. The main premise cited in the resolution to approve denial of the ACA application stated that "The Maury County Board of Education hereby finds that the establishment of the proposed charter school would have substantial negative fiscal impact on Maury County Public Schools." Yet, not a single member of the School Board verbalized any commentary or concerns about "substantial negative fiscal impact," nor did they present or discuss any findings of "substantial negative fiscal impact" on Maury County Schools as stated in the resolution. The school attorney admitted that he wrote the resolution paragraph and then just "cut, pasted and attached the Exhibit A questions, that have been asked and answered repeatedly. Also, Exhibit A mentioned absolutely nothing about "substantial negative fiscal impact" on Maury County Schools.

To make such a powerful declarative statement with "substantial" as a dramatic qualifier was used to imply findings of negative fiscal impacts that were never substantiated. No measurable methodologies such as quantitative analysis of data and metrics, no fiscal impact study, no cost, expenditures and revenue data analysis were ever done to establish any "findings" by a qualified analyst much less the School Board or their staff. And nothing was ever presented to the public. No one bothered to share any findings or actively defend the illusion of a relationship between the accusation of negative fiscal impact on the traditional school system and the alleged but misplaced causation blamed on the charter school application. Since a multivariant analysis was never conducted to adjust for other influential factors and conditions, and no descriptive evidence was ever collected and evaluated, this perceived correlation was never validated.

Instead, this denial was likely based on speculation, fear, flawed personal opinions and bias. Substantial negative fiscal impact is a baseless claim.

- A thorough and detailed application was presented by ACA that complied with the required criteria and standards.
- For those who say we need more information and more answers: There are 31 mandatory statutes adopted by the State of Tennessee that provide all the specificity and detail you could possibly want or need in regard to the regulation of Public Charter Schools.
- Public charter schools have a built-in mechanism of processes and procedures designed and outlined to support a quality educational environment with a strong foundation of accountability, oversight and transparency in exacting detail and subject to the state legislature, this Commission, the charter authority, the Dept. of Education, the State Comptroller of the Treasury, the charter agreement and so much more.
- Fewer than 10% of all students are attending charter schools and on average, charter schools enroll just 3% of students in the school district.

Closing:

In this area of explosive population, family and community growth, and increasing student enrollment, all can be well served by a variety of educational options. Parents, students, families and the community deserve the option and choice of alternative educational programs and facilities. It is possible for various educational alternatives (private, charter, magnet, home and traditional) to coexist and thrive.

I am in opposition to THIS Charter School (ACS)

There are six (6) areas of concern:

I will address:

- 1. Provide less money for classrooms
- 2. Less accountability and control

There is a need for public schools to serve the public good; not special interest!

Charter schools are run by a CEO

They look for Profit or Loss; Don't put a price on my children!

Charter schools do not show better performance than traditional public schools;

They try to cut cost to educate each student; however they spend much more on curriculum and material developers----That's where the money goes;

Not on teachers or students!!

To Whom It May Concern,

I am writing in support of the decision of the Maury County School Board to deny the application of the ACM Charter School. In several areas according to the rubric set forth by the TDOE scoring criteria, it was found to be deficient.

It is concerning to me, the committee was dismissed after the first denial by the board. There were accusations made, public comments made, and phone calls to Superintendent Ventura by some board members in favor of ACM and against the committee's work. I find it very unfair that the committee was accused of collusion, but never asked about their process or their work.

See below my concerns submitted.

Section 1.3 Academic Focus and Plan. (pg. 34) "will collaborate" in the design of the program.

- -"Will develop" a program to provide for struggling students/(pg. 51) No evidenced-based plan to help remediate. "may be to spend 20 min a day"
- -Not yet aligned to TN standards "being worked on" pg. 41
- -Does not include required minutes for math
- no clear plan

Section 1.4 -Academic Performance and Standard: RTI recommended time not met/ no details of a strong plan for RTI that aligns with TN guidelines

- -when and how to measure success
- -standards not aligned to TN
- -No distinct process for measuring, monitoring, ect. Universal Screener to be used?
 - -no plan if the school falls below state, district or its own academic goals. Section 1.7

Strengths noted in application: Intention to follow the RTI2 framework

However: "The data" - such as? What will be used?

-What will be used for RTI intervention?

KEI not used in TN

Section 1.8 concerns

The daily schedule doesn't align with recommended time from RTI manual Section 1.9

- -"the chosen intervention"?
- -Only ELs that need additional support will have ILP. (pg. 92)
- -No clear plan for scheduling services for EL students
- -English Learners- Supplement not supplant?
- 1.10 School Culture and Discipline
- -age appropriate/ who defines?
- Does not clearly define for a Behavior Plan
- -pg. 102 "students worthy of a chance to show their worth
- 1.11 Enrollment
- -Waitlists/ concerns of how parents will be contacted. Communication questions

I am not opposed to Charter schools and parent choice, but according to the rubric as designed by the state of TN, I am not in support of THIS charter school. It does not meet the requirements set forth by the Tennessee Department of Education.

I also find it very interesting that just as the vote was to occur, several emails and text messages were made public through a public records request showing "a plan" by some board members. Please see attached page 2.

I ask that the committee look at the quality of Charter Schools allowed to enter in Tennessee. Please hold them to the high standard set forth in the rubric and guidelines set forth by the state department of education. Please remember your mission of the Charter Commission is "to provide positive academic and life outcomes for Tennessee's students through access to high-quality public charter schools." This is not evident in this application.

Dear Ms. Stovall:

Please share the following information with the Commission. I spoke at the July 27th meeting in Maury County in favor of the proposed charter school. I began my speech with the following paragraph:

"At their July 27, 2023 meeting, the Maury County School Board voted 6-5 against the American Classical Academy application, and then the school attorney passed out a resolution of denial that he prepared in advance for the School Board. The main premise cited in the resolution to approve denial of the ACA application stated that "The Maury County Board of Education hereby finds that the establishment of the proposed charter school would have substantial negative fiscal impact on Maury County Public Schools." Yet, not a single member of the School Board verbalized any commentary or concerns about "substantial negative fiscal impact," nor did they present or discuss any findings of "substantial negative fiscal impact" on Maury County Schools as stated in the resolution." This statement in the resolution sent up to the Commission was never discussed by anyone, school board, the superintendent, the central office staff, or the public. This was quite simply a fabricated premise devised and written by the school attorney and the school board failed to discuss or question it.

There are a couple of other things that are important for the Commission to be aware of. I served on the Maury County Commission for 2 terms beginning in 2014 and retiring in September, 2022. I also served on the County Budget Committee for 7 of the last 9 years so I am very familiar with the school's budgets specifically their food service, operational and capital project's budgets. They never mentioned anything about all the substantial additional revenue they have been given over the past few years from local, state, and federal funding sources. They also have frequently presented to the Commission what their plans are only to change them once we gave them the funding they requested. For several years now, it appears that the school system's biggest challenge has been their substandard financial management and reckless expenditures with the taxpayer, state, and federal dollars. It appears that some very poor decisions have unfortunately prevailed and that the only possible "negative fiscal impact" is generated internally within a school system poorly managed.

Back in 2018, I chaired the Maury County Administration Committee and the Audit Committee. I worked closely with Jim Arnette in the Comptroller's Office and prioritized the establishment of a new financial management system under which the county schools would be managed with oversight by the County Commission and county budget director's office. The school system was having very serious financial discrepancies and difficulties. Teachers were not getting their paychecks and many of those checks had flagrant errors. It was a terrible mess. The county schools were continually cited with findings and had 11 critical findings by state auditors just a few years ago. The superintendent and the school board at the time (half of whom are still on the school board) sent the Commission a letter opposing any financial management act that would have the county oversee the school's budgets and finances. I introduced a template that the Comptroller's office provided me and I also served on the Committee that created a new private act for the county entitled the Maury County Financial Management System of 2018. It was approved by the General Assembly and the County Commission.

Some of us have observed what we would describe as the appearance of wasteful spending, questionable financial decisions, and misleading or incorrect statements by the county school's board, superintendent, and central office staff. Recently, the school board approved the purchase of land for a new elementary school for which they have no funding. They asked for \$50 million dollars for this school which was denied entirely by the County Commission. So, even though they have no funding for the new school, they went ahead and approved purchasing the land without even reading the contract or notifying the public of the location. They kept this information off their work session and voting meeting agendas. They approved the purchase of land valued at \$750,000 dollars and paid \$4.25 million dollars! I share this background information with you because it is important for you to know that recommendations are often presented to the decision-making School Board and the County Commission with partial or inaccurate information presented by the superintendent and central office staff. Our schools are not performing well or being managed well. As a result, students are floundering and failing per test scores that are and have been well documented. The parents, students and community need and overwhelmingly support alternative educational facilities like the proposed charter school.

Lastly, it was the original review committee that did the criteria evaluations using the rubric. What you may not know is that this committee was completely hand-selected by the school superintendent and was stacked by design with herself, central office staff, department heads, current and former school administrators (both principals and vice-principals), and a former school board member who left the school board in 2022. And the review committee in Maury County read through and used questions and concerns presented for criteria evaluations in other counties where charter school applications had been submitted Then the school board took over and wrote out their comments and questions (what the school attorney referred to as "Exhibit A"). The first vote was 6-5 against but it is interesting to note that only 5 school

this means is that the one deciding no vote never provided any negative feedback or concerns. What the chair of the school board delayed another vote. Why? Even though he had a quorum to conduct business and take another final vote, he intentionally made the decision on his own (unilaterally) to postponed any further votes until 2 missing school board members (who he knew were opposed to the charter school) could attend and be present to vote!! This was a terrible manipulation of the charter school vote and resulting outcome.

Please vote to support the Public Charter School proposed for Maury County. Thank you for your time and attention to this important subject.
