"Does Not Meet Standard" — for the entire Academic Plan & Design section, despite confirming completion of all required materials.

MSCS CLAIM: "The mission/goals are vague and not measurable."

REBUTTAL:

The amended mission clearly states a Montessori-based, trauma-informed K–12 curriculum focused on high-needs homeless and housing-insecure youth

Outcomes include specific performance indicators (attendance, stability, grade-level mastery).

Rep. Camper's letter reinforces the urgency and alignment of our mission with the public good and state priorities.

MSCS CLAIM: "No process for monitoring, revising goals using data."

REBUTTAL:

We included an assessment cadence, formative data review process, and universal screener implementation.

Attachment references and tables support this. A supplemental table could be cited if necessary.

The amended Section 1.3 directly addresses how student data will drive instructional revision.

MSCS CLAIM: "Curriculum lacks depth—no EPSO, RTI2, or foundational literacy."

REBUTTAL:

EPSO and WBL were added in the amendment.

RTI² was included in Section 1.2 and supported by the explanation of multi-tiered supports and instructional scaffolding.

Foundational literacy and screener requirements are acknowledged in the assessment plan.

MSCS CLAIM: "No tutoring, remediation, or summer school plan."

REBUTTAL:

As stated in the amendment, state law (T.C.A. 49-6-3024) prohibits requiring these unless the school is operational.

The intent to offer optional, grant-funded summer services was discussed — this is the correct compliance posture.

Page 12-13: Additional Concerns

1. Assessment alignment and screener

REBUTTED: We clarified screener compliance (T.C.A. 49-1-905) and formative assessment structure.

2. Lack of identified geographic area

REBUTTED: We stated Dream Catchers serves all of Shelby County and homeless students are by nature city-wide; the Homeless Food Truck has over 500 direct contacts. Strong justification.

3. Community Partners: lack of MOUs / support

REBUTTED: We corrected this in amended 1.6. Plus, survey results sent to 1,000 partners show strong regional buy-in. We've embedded a screenshot and data tables.

4. Special populations staffing & compliance

REBUTTED: Section 1.8 was fully restructured to meet this — We confirmed use of licensed special education teachers and support roles for at-risk, EL, and SWD students. Also embedded RTI² approach.

CONCLUSION

Key Inconsistencies Exposed:

MSCS marked all required sections as "Yes" / Complete but still issued a blanket "Does Not Meet" grade.

They ignored embedded evidence, survey data, updated curriculum detail, and federal grant approval.

Their criticisms are either legally inaccurate (e.g., summer school) or factually false (We did address EPSO, RTI², community feedback, etc).

Fully Addressed Concern 2: Explicit alignment to the TN State Accountability Framework is shown.

Fully Addressed Concern 3: Clearly defined metrics and sources of data (TVAAS, MAP, attendance, etc.).

PAGE 15: MSCS Reviewer Feedback & Concerns

Section 3.2 – Assessments

Concern 1: Assessments beyond state-required ones (like MAP, formative benchmarks) were not clearly explained.

Concern 2: It was unclear how formative assessments would drive instruction.

Concern 3: No clear plan for sharing assessment data with students and families.

REBUTTAL: Amended Response on Page 15

Added detailed narrative on use of MAP Growth (3x/year) and weekly formative quizzes.

MSCS Review Claim (Page 20):

Application fails to describe how it meets TN graduation requirements (credits, GPA, transcripts, diploma types).

EPSO/WBL lacks detail—only mentioned generally, without courses or exams.

RTI² framework is too limited and lacks necessary components.

No plan for foundational literacy beyond a "recitation of the law."

Tutoring and summer school plans are vague—identification, staffing, and program details missing.

*Rebuttal Amended Application (Pages 19–24):

* The amended application explicitly outlines multiple diploma pathways, including a Special Education certificate, showing alignment with graduation needs of various student populations.

*RTI² is clearly stated as the framework for underperforming students, and although the evaluator says components are missing, the amended pages provide tiered instruction summaries and proposed support.

*Tutoring (before and after school) and summer school are mentioned, with intent and baseline structure described—including timing, gaps being addressed, and target students.

* EPSO/WBL are included with clarity that these offerings will grow as enrollment increases, aligning with TDOE's guidance for phased expansion.

Yes, the description of foundational literacy could be expanded beyond citing the law, but state-approved screeners (AimsWeb and iReady) were added—proving alignment with T.C.A. 49-1-905.

Conclusion: The MSCS evaluation blatantly ignored the added depth in RTI², diploma pathways, tutoring intent, and EPSO/WBL sequencing.

1.3 Assessments

MSCS Review Claim (Pages 21-22):

Lacks details about faculty/staff who will administer assessments.

EL information outdated and should be updated.

No clear plan for data collection, analysis, or alignment with proposed academic plan.

Assessment cadence, grade bands, and data systems not well defined.

Rebuttal Amended Application (Pages 23–30):

- * Nationally normed Universal Reading Screeners (AimsWeb, iReady) are clearly identified as required by law.
- * Assessment overview is presented with formative/summative intent, alignment to standards, and grade bands, covering pages 26–28.
- * There is explicit mention of two data systems, and while MSCS wants more "features," the application clearly shows intent to track growth over time.
- * EL data and professional development are outlined with basic scaffolding on how data will support instruction.

While it is true that the application does not name specific individuals for assessment roles—but no law requires named staff prior to hiring. That is a logistical detail, not a deficiency.

Conclusion: The MSCS response minimizes strong assessment structures already present, especially the inclusion of nationally normed screeners. The amended application obviously meets foundational expectations.

1.4 School Calendar and Schedule

MSCS Review Claim (Pages 23–24):

The calendar doesn't include sample daily schedules for different grade bands.

Lacks evidence of differentiation by grade or clear K–12 structure.

Clubs and tutoring details missing.

RTI² not well integrated into the calendar.

Saturday/Summer school resource plan vague.

Rebuttal Amended Application (Pages 34–39):

* Statutory days and hours are met and outlined, with calendar updated in line with TN law.

*Application includes differentiated scheduling language,

*Clubs and extracurriculars are discussed—including types, purpose, and alignment with student engagement.

* Summer school and Saturday programming are noted with goals and timing

Conclusion: MSCS overlooked updates to both calendar alignment and enrichment programming. The compliance and intent are clearly established.

1.5 Recruitment and Enrollment

MSCS Review Claim (Page 25):

Lacks geographic region discussion and alignment to need.

Enrollment summary inconsistencies—capacity vs. table data not aligned.

Rebuttal Amended Application (Pages 31, 33–34):

*The application describes a county-wide enrollment vision, tied to data showing no other school specializes in homeless students.

* A survey of over 2,000 community members confirming demand was included.

* The target enrollment and demographics are projected, with intentional priority for homeless and at-risk students as required by law.

Yes, there appears to be a discrepancy between the stated capacity of 1,000 students and a table—this was a clerical issue, not substantive.

Conclusion: The district appears to conflate a small data inconsistency with a failure to justify demand. We clearly define need, demand, recruitment priorities, and enrollment strategy, especially for an underserved population.

Many of their concerns reflect a desire for expanded detail, not actual non-compliance with state charter standards. Most issues flagged are procedural preferences, not substantive legal deficiencies.

The application:

Aligns with state law on assessments, academic days, enrollment, and diploma pathways.

Addresses the needs of at-risk students using a tiered support model.

Shows intent and structure for foundational literacy, tutoring, and EPSO/WBL expansion.

PAGES 26-31

MSCS Concern #1:

"Enrollment summary table does not align with projections in the application."

Ref: Pages 3, 33-34, 48, 50

Rebuttal:

The amended application explicitly includes revised enrollment projections for Years 1–5, including a detailed growth model based on facilities, transportation access, and community demand. MSCS appears to ignore the updated table and continues referencing outdated data. Page 33 and Attachment W provide sufficient clarity on anticipated enrollment targets and related staffing.

MSCS Concern #2:

"Fails to define school's geographic region and how it aligns to need/demand."

Ref: Page 47

Rebuttal:

The amended application specifies that Dream Catchers will serve the entire Shelby County region, with emphasis on homeless youth often outside traditional zoning structures. Page 31 provides data from public agencies and local homelessness coalitions, clearly articulating demand across zip codes—not limited to one narrow region. This is in line with McKinney-Vento law, which prioritizes school stability over proximity.

MSCS Concern #3:

"Enrollment and lottery policies are unclear or non-compliant with state law."

Ref: Pages 110-115, Attachment C

Rebuttal:

Attachment C includes a fully compliant Enrollment Policy, detailing timelines, lottery procedures, and admission criteria consistent with Tennessee Code Annotated § 49-13-113. MSCS offers no specific examples of non-compliance. Our language matches the TDOE's own guidance, and the added explanations in Attachment C cover waitlists, re-enrollment, and non-discrimination clauses.

MSCS Concern #4:

"Recruitment campaign is sparse and lacks identified partners."

Ref: Page 32, 45

Rebuttal:

The amended application outlines a clear multi-channel recruitment strategy (pg. 45),

including text-message outreach, community canvassing, and collaboration with

housing agencies. Furthermore, Attachment W lists the Recruitment & Outreach

Coordinator role and associated job functions, directly addressing the original concern.

Multiple Memphis-based organizations expressed support in Attachments D and F.

MSCS Concern #5:

"Applicant doesn't detail how to draw homeless families into the school."

Ref: Page 45

Rebuttal:

Pages 44–47 detail engagement strategies specifically targeting McKinney-Vento

students, including on-site enrollment events at shelters, transportation assistance, and

flexible scheduling. The application explicitly outlines how Dream Catchers will remove

traditional barriers to access, making this concern both inaccurate and dismissive of

vulnerable populations.

MSCS Concern #6:

"Retention strategies for homeless students are underdeveloped."

Ref: Pages 45-47

Rebuttal:

Retention measures in the amended application include:

17 of 40

On-site mental health services
Trauma-informed care
Uniform & supply banks
Transportation continuity
Stable placement regardless of shelter status
These all comply with McKinney-Vento federal protections, yet MSCS' evaluation fails to acknowledge or quote this section, revealing either negligence or bias in their review.
MSCS Concern #7:
"Parent/community engagement strategies lack evidence of execution or buy-in."
Ref: Pages 36–38, Attachments D
Rebuttal:
Wer team submitted:
Survey responses sent to 1000+ residents
Support from over a dozen community leaders

Page 60 clearly outlines plans for a Parent Advisory Council, Parent Circles, and

workshops

The Charter Office's dismissal of these actions as "insufficient" shows a clear disregard

for truth and grassroots engagement, particularly from underserved communities.

MSCS Concern #8:

"Lack of an executable plan to meet enrollment targets."

Ref: Section 1.6

Rebuttal:

The amended application includes a 5-year strategic plan, staff recruitment timelines, and projected ratios for social workers, educators, and specialists aligned with growth. These are referenced in the budget, organizational chart, and recruitment sections. The

state of Tennessee recognized the plan as viable enough to award a \$750,000 grant,

validating its feasibility.

MSCS Concern #9:

"School culture and discipline policy lacks vision or alignment with Montessori."

Ref: Pages 40–42, 69–71, Attachment F

Rebuttal:

Attachment F and pgs. 68–70 clearly describe:

Restorative justice philosophy

19 of 40

Positive behavior reinforcement

Staff training in Montessori mixed-age classroom management

Policies ensuring no suspension/expulsion of homeless students without intervention plans

Furthermore, Dream Catchers planned a two-week trauma-informed Montessori training (pg. 68), going beyond MSCS requirements. The evaluation overlooks this substantive addition.

MSCS Concern #10:

"Applicant lacks clear strategy for chronic absenteeism, a key issue in homeless populations."

Ref: Pg. 70

Rebuttal:

The amended application includes a 3-tiered strategy:

Emergency visits & transportation support

Daily attendance incentives

Family liaison assigned to every student flagged for absentee risk

These are nationally accepted best practices in districts with high McKinney-Vento populations. Again, the Charter Office seems unwilling to credit the research-based solutions presented.

Conclusion for Pages 26-31:

The MSCS review continues to **selectively ignore substantial improvements and legally compliant strategies** included in the amended application. Their dismissal of state-aligned policies, evidence of community support, and a robust support system for homeless youth <u>underscores either gross negligence or entrenched bias against the mission of Dream Catchers Academy.</u>

Pages 32-37

SECTION 1.8 – SPECIAL POPULATIONS

MSCS Concern #1: No leadership team members identified with experience supporting students with disabilities (SWD), English Learners (EL), or gifted students.

Rebuttal: The amended application identifies a Special Populations Coordinator and outlines their qualifications and responsibilities in overseeing compliance with IDEA, EL instruction, and support for other vulnerable groups (pages 74, 113–114, Attachment W).

MSCS Concern #2: No protocols provided for eligibility determination, monitoring, or exit for special populations.

Rebuttal: The amended application details protocols for identification, intervention, and service delivery for SWD, EL, gifted, homeless, and economically disadvantaged students (pages 74–79).

MSCS Concern#3: Information about English Learners was outdated and lacked clarity.

Rebuttal The amended application incorporates updated guidance on EL programming, including the role of certified ESL instructors and compliance with state and federal regulations (page 76).

MSCS Concern #4: Vague explanation about how students with disabilities will receive appropriate diplomas.

Rebuttal: We clearly outline diploma options tailored for SWD in accordance with IEP goals and graduation requirements (page 78).

MSCS Concern#5: Did not explain how the Montessori model will be applied to special populations.

Rebuttal: Clarified that Montessori instruction is inherently differentiated and individualized, which is ideal for special populations. Instructional supports and IEP accommodations will be integrated into the classroom design (pages 17–46).

SECTION 1.9 - CONVERSION SCHOOL PLANNING

MSCS Concern 1: N/A (This section applies only to conversion charter school proposals).

Our Response: Correctly marked "N/A" as Dream Catchers is not a conversion charter school.

SECTION 2.1 – GOVERNANCE

MSCS Concern #1: Governance documents included placeholders like "[Insert Member]" and lacked finalized structure.

Rebuttal: Finalized governance documents were submitted in the amended application. Board members and their roles were clearly identified. Policies and bylaws are included (page 74 and governance attachments).

MSCS Concern #2: Confusion between the listed nonprofit and its Secretary of State filing (All Women's Bible College vs. Daughters of Zion).

Rebuttal: The organization's name was legally changed to Daughters of Zion nearly three years ago, and this change was officially approved by both the State of Tennessee and the Internal Revenue Service, as documented in the amended application. Despite the inclusion of this evidence, Memphis-Shelby County Schools (MSCS) continued to rely on an outdated and factually incorrect narrative, suggesting a religious affiliation.

The amended application clearly explains that Daughters of Zion is the recognized operating name of the nonprofit and is not a religious institution. This clarification is found in Section 1.1 of the Amended Application and is supported by Attachment A (IRS Determination Letter) and Attachment B (Tennessee Name Change Documentation).

SECTION 2.2 - FACILITIES

MSCS Concern #1: Facility plans were vague, no confirmed location or backup plans.

Rebuttal: The Memphis-Shelby County Schools (MSCS) facility-related criticism is factually incorrect and misleading. In our amended application, we provided a list of more than half a dozen potential facility sites, along with detailed plans to finalize site selection upon state approval. These included both long-term and contingency options, all thoroughly documented and aligned with budget and operational readiness.

Yet MSCS's evaluation repeated the same concerns raised during the initial application process—without addressing or acknowledging the new facility information submitted. This strongly suggests that MSCS failed to conduct a robust, fair, or updated review of the amended application, in violation of the requirements under Tenn. Code Ann. § 49-13-108(b)(3), which mandates objective, rubric-aligned, written justification based on the application as submitted.

MSCS Concern #2: Did not address building readiness, renovations, or budget for upgrades.

Rebuttal:

This concern is demonstrably inaccurate. Dream Catchers Charter School's amended application explicitly listed over half a dozen potential facility sites, each of which was thoroughly researched and identified as a viable option for school operations. These locations were presented to demonstrate both readiness and flexibility in securing a compliant facility aligned with the school's mission and timeline.

Facilities can be finalized post-approval, and the Commission may delay opening up to one year, evidencing statutory flexibility. § 49-13-108(b)(5)(D).

Most notably, the amended application of Dream Catchers included a sizable contingency fund within the budget to absorb unforeseen building-related costs, ensuring financial stability and operational readiness even in the face of unexpected construction or compliance issues.

Standards focus on feasibility, not a deed in hand. Policy 6.111, Principle 2(4) directs authorizers to focus on outcomes rather than processes. The state's approach (and Commission practice) assesses feasibility and a credible plan, not necessarily a finalized address at application. Penalizing the absence of a secured site at this stage elevates process over outcome, contrary to Policy 6.111.

Use of rubric and objective reasons. If MSCS believed the facility plan was not "viable," it must specify objective deficiencies connected to the rubric (e.g., square-footage ratios, occupancy loads, code citations) per § 49-13-108(b)(3); generalized assertions of "unknown geography" are insufficient.

Timeline flexibility in law. Even the Commission may approve an application and require a delayed opening up to one year through the charter agreement, acknowledging facilities can finalize post-approval. Rigidly requiring a pre-approval address is inconsistent with the statute's contemplated flexibility. See § 49-13-108(b)(5)(D).

SECTION 2.3 - START-UP PLAN

MSCS Concern#1: Start-up plan omitted essential staffing and facility steps.

Rebuttal: The amended application includes a detailed, month-by-month startup timeline, with named leads for each milestone (facility, staff hiring, training, curriculum, enrollment).

SECTION 2.4 - PERSONNEL / HUMAN CAPITAL

MSCS Concern#1: Staffing projections were inconsistent and PD plans were vague.

Rebuttal: Staff roles and FTE projections align with the instructional plan and budget. Recruitment strategies, benefits, and compensation schedules are clarified. PD plan includes summer retreats and onboarding sessions tailored to our unique model.

SECTION 2.5 – PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

MSCS Concern#1: No plan for how PD will be decided or evaluated.

Rebuttal: PD is designed to be responsive and data-informed. The leadership team will evaluate its effectiveness through educator feedback, student performance, and compliance with TDOE evaluation criteria.

SECTION 2.6 – TRANSPORTATION

MSCS Concern#1: Plan did not align with state or federal laws.

Rebuttal: The amended application explicitly states compliance with McKinney-Vento, IDEA, and TDOE transportation guidelines. Daily transportation will be provided for all students, and vendors will be selected through a competitive RFP process.

MSCS Final Review (Page 37) – Strengths Acknowledged:

Governance documentation revised and included.

Facility requirements clarified and budgeted.

PD plans explained and aligned with model.

Transportation and food service RFP plans included.

Insurance and compliance documentation included.

State-Standards Rebuttal (Shortcomings in MSCS Review):

Religious affiliation vs. legality. Tennessee law requires charter schools to operate as public, nonsectarian, nonreligious schools; it does not disqualify a sponsor merely because it has religious ties. If MSCS's concern rested on affiliation rather than evidence the school would operate sectarian, that is legally misplaced. See T.C.A. § 49-13-111(a)(2) (nonsectarian operation requirement).

Objective, written reasons. When denying or continuing to fault an amended application, the authorizer must state objective reasons in writing tied to the rubric. Broad statements like "lacks detail" without objective metrics fall short of T.C.A. § 49-13-108(b)(3).

Use of the state rubric and fair, transparent process. Policy 6.111 requires authorizers to use the state application and rubric and follow fair, transparent procedures; decisions should be based on an accumulation of evidence—including curing of prior deficiencies in the amended application. MSCS's continued reliance on items We corrected (e.g., training plan, complaint process) conflicts with these standards.

Board training. State law requires annual board training; We added this. Critique for lacking a separate "self-evaluation instrument" is not a statutory requirement and is reasonably addressed via policy development post-approval. See § 49-13-111(a)(o) (annual board training).

PAGES 50-55

Subsection 2.7 – Additional Operations

MSCS Evaluation:

Insurance letter only showed basic coverage (e.g., for athletics), not all required provisions.

Food plan didn't align with the school's mission or describe breakfast, serving times, or meal selection.

Technology plan was vague — no clear info on access, implementation, or budget alignment.

Oversight of the school nurse unclear; Operations Manager not budgeted.

Safety and emergency ops plan underdeveloped, with no timeline or process provided.

Rebuttal:

Amended Application:

Insurance letter updated to include appropriate coverage.

Food service plan revised with meal patterns, serving times, and vendor guidance.

Budget updated to include nurse and Operations Manager positions.

"Safety and emergency ops plan underdeveloped, with no timeline or process provided."

This concern is inaccurate and misleading. In the amended application, Dream Catchers Charter School provided a clear and comprehensive Safety and Emergency Operations Plan, which includes:

Detailed protocols for fire, weather, medical, and lockdown emergencies;

Assigned responsibilities for trained personnel;

Compliance assurances with T.C.A. § 49-6-807 and T.C.A. § 49-6-1006;

A defined process for developing and periodically updating the Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) in collaboration with local emergency management authorities and first responders.

Furthermore, the narrative also affirms that all staff will receive annual training, and safety drills will be conducted in compliance with state law. These items demonstrate a clearly defined process and timeline aligned with state expectations.

MSCS's recycled response appears to have ignored the amended content, which again suggests a lack of robust review of the submitted materials.

MSCS Evaluation:

Not applicable (N/A). No CMO details were provided in either the initial or amended applications.

MSCS Evaluation:

Not applicable (N/A). No content submitted in either round.

MSCS Evaluation:

Not applicable (N/A). No content submitted in either round.

Reviewer Rating: Not Applicable

PAGE 57 - Section 2.12: School Replication

Reviewer Rating: Not Applicable

PAGE 58 – Section 3.1: Operating Budget

Reviewer Rating: Does Not Meet Standard

Reviewer's Claims:

Attachment W (Operating Budget) was incomplete.

Budget does not include five years of revenue and expenditure projections.

Budget doesn't align with enrollment and staffing projections.

Some revenue sources are not identified or are unsupported.

No contingency plan if enrollment targets aren't met.

Lacks clear financial controls, including who handles payroll, purchasing, audits, etc.

Rebuttal: What the Amended Application Actually Addressed:

Attachment W was revised to include detailed revenue and expenditure projections from pre-opening through Year 5.

Enrollment figures and staffing levels in the budget were revised to match the educational plan and HR narrative.

Added realistic revenue projections that matched state and federal funding streams, using publicly available per-pupil revenue estimates.

Included conservative estimates for IDEA and Title I funds, and noted contingency planning if those funds were delayed.

Clarified that a licensed CPA firm would oversee financial controls, perform audits, and ensure compliance with GAAP.

PAGE 59 – Section 3.2: Budget Narrative

Reviewer Rating: Partially Meets Standard

Reviewer's Claims:

Narrative does not explain major assumptions.

No justification for grant revenue projections.

No explanation for funding for special populations.
Still no contingency planning.
Role of CPA firm unclear; lack of internal oversight.
Rebuttal: What the Amended Application Actually Addressed:
Budget narrative was expanded to explain assumptions for staffing costs, per-pupil
state funding, Title I/IDEA projections, and operational expenses.
Cited sources for anticipated federal funding, using conservative figures.
Added detail on how funds would be allocated to support SPED and ELL students,
aligned with Section 1.8 on special populations.
Included contingency language: "If enrollment targets are not met, discretionary
expenses will be delayed, and administrative hiring will be phased."
Clarified that the school will partner with an external CPA firm and that internal
oversight will be handled by the Board Finance Committee and Executive Director.
The reviewer ignores the specific contingency language added in the narrative.

The reviewer failed to acknowledge that the CPA firm's role was expanded and clarified in multiple sections, including Attachment W.



PAGE 60 - Section 3.3: Network Financial Plan

Reviewer Rating: Does Not Meet Standard

Reviewer's Claims:

Assumptions are not conservative.

Revenue projections not backed by documentation.

No fallback plan if grants/donations are not received.

Budget lacks cash flow or reserve plan.

Rebuttal: What the Amended Application Actually Addressed:

Conservative assumptions were built in – school used state averages for per-pupil revenue, minimized expectations for philanthropic support in Year 1.

Grants were included only after Year 1, and labeled as "anticipated" with notes about alternate plans if delayed.

Explained that the school would build reserves through conservative spending and delayed hiring.

Though not labeled "cash flow analysis," the narrative laid out monthly expenditure pacing and startup cost coverage via reserves and deferral strategies.

The application did include a reserve and contingency strategy; it was not acknowledged.

No recognition that this was a non-network applicant, yet the reviewer seemed to apply network-level funding expectations.

The amended application substantially clarified financial controls, revenue projections, staffing alignment, and contingency measures.

Oversight structures were described: CPA + Finance Committee + Executive Director.

Budget aligned with enrollment and staffing after amendment.

Funding assumptions were based on realistic estimates with conservative backup plans.

Reviewer failed to revise their assessment despite clear improvements, suggesting potential bias or insufficient review of amended content.

PAGE 62 ANALYSIS

Section 3.2 – Operating Budget Narrative (Part 1)

MSCS Criticism #1: "Revenue Sources Remain Unidentified"

"Revenue sources remain unclear and unsupported with documentation. There are no confirmations or commitment letters for grants, private donations, or other revenue streams that would sustain the school beyond BEP allocations."

— MSCS Reviewer, Page 62

Rebuttal Amended Application (Pages 91–92) Correctly Responded:

Lists multiple revenue sources: BEP, Title I, IDEA, philanthropic funds, and competitive grants.

Explicitly notes that startup funding is being actively pursued and will scale as the school gains approval.

Most importantly,ee were awarded a \$750,000 Tennessee Charter School Start-Up Grant, which:

Is a verified, competitive, and state-funded source.

Was completely ignored by MSCS in its review.

Confirms external vetting of the academic and operational plan by the State of Tennessee Charter School Office.

The application did identify diverse revenue sources. And the \$750,000 grant award directly contradicts the claim that no revenue sources are "confirmed." Ignoring that we received one of the state's most competitive startup grants is not just inaccurate — it undermines the credibility of MSCS's review.

MSCS Criticism #2: "Lack of Budget Methodology"

"The applicant does not offer any rationale for how the amounts in the operating budget were calculated."

The Amended Application (Page 92) Clearly Includes:

Salary scales tied to public district comparables.

Facilities costs based on regional market rates.

Technology, transportation, and materials costs broken out per student.

5-year budget aligned with enrollment growth and school capacity phases.

The methodology is explicitly detailed in the budget narrative and aligned with other sections of the application. The State of Tennessee grant reviewers deemed the budget realistic enough to fund it with \$750,000 — which further invalidates MSCS's claim that the budget lacks clarity or justification.

PAGE 63 ANALYSIS

Section 3.2 – Operating Budget Narrative

MSCS Criticism #3: "No Contingency Plan for Enrollment Shortfalls"

"There is no contingency plan in place in the event that enrollment is lower than projected."

Rebuttal: The Amended Application (Page 93):

Provides a multi-tiered expenditure plan that scales based on actual enrollment.

Lists non-essential startup items that will be deferred if revenues are lower than anticipated.

Includes staffing flexibility — hiring will adjust based on initial student demand.

The contingency plan exists and mirrors industry best practices. Plus, the \$750,000 start-up grant gives the school a financial cushion to navigate Year 1 fluctuations, further mitigating risk.

MSCS Criticism #4: "No Details on Financial Oversight or CPA Controls"

"There is no mention of financial oversight measures or how the governing board will monitor spending. No documentation is provided regarding use of an independent auditor or internal controls."

Rebuttal: The Amended Application (Pages 147–151):

Names a Finance Committee for budget review and policy compliance.

Describes independent CPA audits and monthly reconciliation processes.

Includes a two-signature policy and transparent board reporting.

These financial policies are clearly described and consistent with TN state charter authorizer requirements. Again, the grant would not have been awarded without demonstrating strong financial controls, which were part of the grant review rubric.

MSCS Criticism #5: "Revenue Projections for Title I and IDEA Appear Inflated"

"The operating budget may be overly reliant on federal funding projections. Title I and IDEA allocations are based on formulas, and no conservative estimates were provided."

Rebuttal: Amended Application (Page 91):

Labels Title I and IDEA as "anticipated revenues" based on enrollment and FRPL data.

Includes conservative per-pupil estimates aligned with Tennessee charter norms.

Clearly explains that if those funds are not realized, startup grant funds and flexible spending priorities will adjust accordingly.

No exaggeration exists. The projections are reasonable and cross-checked with state averages. The presence of the \$750,000 startup grant serves as a fallback against lower-than-expected federal funding.
