BLUFF CITY HIGH SCHOOL

- Current projected enrollment for SY21-22: 590
 - Maximum enrollment in charter agreement: 616
- Facility status: fully built out
- Grade levels: 9-12
- Current BEP PPA: \$10,029
- Highlights/Focus:
 - Staffing for SY21-22
 - Continue facility build out (gym/athletic fields)
 - Graduated 135 students in summer 2021
 - Will receive TNReady assessment data in late July/early August



KIPP ANTIOCH COLLEGE PREP ELEMENTARY

- Current projected enrollment for SY21-22: 566
 - Maximum enrollment in charter agreement: 750 (grades K-5)
- Facility status: fully built out
- Grade level status: Will serve grades K-3
- Current BEP PPA: \$11,963
- Highlights/Focus for SY21-22
 - Hiring and on-boarding new staff for new grade levels
 - TN Ready assessments for SY21-22



KIPP ANTIOCH COLLEGE PREP MIDDLE

- Current projected enrollment for SY21-22: 396
 - Maximum enrollment in charter agreement: 544 (grades 5-8)
- Facility status: KACPM moving into new building
- Grade level status: Will serve grades 5-7
- Current BEP PPA: \$11,963
- Highlights/Focus for SY21-22
 - Hiring and on-boarding new staff for new grade levels
 - Will receive TNReady assessment data in late July/early August



NASHVILLE COLLEGIATE PREP

- Current projected enrollment for SY21-22: 333
 - Projected Year 1 enrollment in application: 470
- Facility status: Moving into building mid-July
- Grade level status: Opening K-5
- Current BEP PPA: \$11,963
- Highlights/Focus for SY21-22
 - Open with strong enrollment to meet budget projections
 - Staff school in support of academic program
 - Start academic program strong in Year 1



NEW START APPEALS

- The following districts are still considering charter school applications:
 - Fayette County: 1 Application
 - Williamson County: 1 Application
 - Rutherford County: 1 Application
 - Metro Nashville Public Schools: 2 Applications
- The Charter Commission can expect to receive any new start appeals in early August.
- The Charter Commission will have 75 days to review and vote on any appeal. The new start appeals will be considered at the October 2021 meeting.
- At the September special-called meeting, Commissioners will receive training from staff to prepare for the October meeting.
