By January 2020 DHS will have active 2Gen partnerships with 23 agencies across the state

2Gen is a whole-family centered approach that focuses equally and intentionally on services and opportunities for the child and caregiver designed to end generational cycles of poverty.



Shelby County's Agape Family and Children Services 2Gen program reaches 645 families. 5.56% of those served no longer live in poverty.



United Way of Metro Nashville's Rapid Rehousing program helped 102 families enter stable housing in a 9 month period.

Partnered with Project Return to serve more than 190 enrollees in reaching employment

More than 25,000 children served through the Smart Steps Child Care Payment Assistance program. As of December 2019, DHS licensed 2,367 child care agencies.

The DHS partnership with the Governor's Early Literacy Foundation has resulted in 28,600 children registered to receive the monthly gift of books.

The National Resource Center for Health and Safety in Child Care and Early Education has ranked Tennessee's child care regulations as 1st in the nation as most supportive of obesity prevention.

More than 10,400 vulnerable adults served through Adult Protective Services.
