

REGISTRY OF ELECTION FINANCE

The Registry of Election Finance met Wednesday, June 14, 2006, at Suite 1614 of Parkway Towers, 404 James Robertson Parkway, Nashville, Tennessee.

Attending the meeting were board members Karen Dunavant, George Harding, Darlene McNeece, John McClarty, Lee Anne Murray and Marian Ott.

Director Rawlins requested that the board rescind the show cause notice that was issued to Tony Delucia at the May 10, 2006 meeting. Director Rawlins informed that board that Mr. Delucia had a \$0 balance on his report and therefore he did not owe a campaign financial disclosure report.

On motion by Ott, seconded by McClarty, the board voted to rescind the show cause notice issued to Tony Delucia and to approve the May 10, 2006 board minutes as amended. The motion passed the board unanimously.

Sworn Statement Submitted

06-08 Jim Jamieson, for failure to file a 2005 annual supplemental campaign financial disclosure report. Class two (2), no report filed, maximum ten thousand (\$10,000) civil penalty. Mr. Jamieson has had no previous matters before the board.

The board voted at its May 10, 2006 board meeting to issue Mr. Jamieson a show cause notice.

Mr. Jamieson submitted a sworn statement for the board's consideration. In this statement, Mr. Jamieson explained that he was under the assumption that since he had an outstanding loan from himself that he was not required to submit the report and that the loan would be written off. Mr. Jamieson further explained that his misunderstanding of the campaign financial disclosure law caused his failure to file the required report.

A motion was made by Harding, seconded by McClarty, to take no action in this matter. A friendly amendment was made by Ott, accepted by Harding and McClarty, to assess Mr. Jamieson a \$100 civil penalty. The motion to assess Mr. Jamieson a \$100 civil penalty passed the board unanimously.

Cases Subject to Approval for Civil Penalty

06-09 Suzanne Fisher, for failure to file a 2005 year-end lobbying activities report. Class one (1), no report filed, maximum seven hundred fifty (\$750) civil penalty. Ms. Fisher has had a previous matter before the board.

The board voted at its May 10, 2006 board meeting to issue Ms. Fisher a show cause notice.

Director Rawlins informed the board that there has been no response to the show cause notice and that the report still has not been filed.

On motion by Ott, seconded by McNeece, the board voted unanimously to assess Ms. Fisher a \$750 civil penalty.

06-10 Jerry Hall, for failure to file a 2005 year-end lobbying activities report. Class one (1), no report filed, maximum seven hundred fifty (\$750) civil penalty. Mr. Hall has had a previous matter before the board.

The board voted at its May 10, 2006 board meeting to issue Mr. Hall a show cause notice.

Director Rawlins informed the board that there has been no response to the show cause notice and that the report still has not been filed.

On motion by Dunavant, seconded by McNeece, the board voted unanimously to assess Mr. Hall a \$750 civil penalty.

06-11 Megan Macaraeg, for failure to file a 2005 year-end lobbying activities report. Class one (1), no report filed, maximum seven hundred fifty (\$750) civil penalty. Ms. Macaraeg has had a previous matter before the board.

The board voted at its May 10, 2006 board meeting to issue Ms. Macaraeg a show cause notice.

Director Rawlins informed the board that there has been no response to the show cause notice and that the report still has not been filed.

On motion by McNeece, seconded by Ott, the board voted unanimously to assess Ms. Macaraeg a \$750 civil penalty.

06-12 Ron Redwing, for failure to file a 2005 year-end lobbying activities report. Class one (1), no report filed, maximum seven hundred fifty (\$750) civil penalty. Mr. Redwing has had no previous matters before the board.

The board voted at its May 10, 2006 board meeting to issue Mr. Redwing a show cause notice.

Director Rawlins informed the board that Mr. Redwing had requested to appear before the Registry at the meeting but had not appeared for the meeting and that the report still has not been filed.

On motion by Ott, seconded by McNeece, the board voted unanimously to assess Mr. Redwing a \$750 civil penalty.

06-13 Bob Stubblefield, for failure to file a 2005 year-end lobbying activities report. Class one (1), no report filed, maximum seven hundred fifty (\$750) civil penalty. Mr. Stubblefield has had a previous matter before the board.

The board voted at its May 10, 2006 board meeting to issue Mr. Stubblefield a show cause notice.

Director Rawlins informed the board that there has been no response to the show cause notice and that the report still has not been filed.

On motion by Harding, seconded by McNeece, the board voted unanimously to assess Mr. Stubblefield a \$750 civil penalty.

Cases Considered for Issuance of Show Cause Notice

Larry Drolsum, for failure to timely file a 2005 annual supplemental campaign financial disclosure report. Class one (1), 13 days late, maximum three hundred twenty-five (\$325) civil penalty. Mr. Drolsum has had no previous matters before the board.

On motion by Ott, seconded by McNeece, the board voted unanimously to issue a show cause notice.

Charles Richard Hughes, for failure to timely file a 2006 pre-primary campaign financial disclosure report. Class two (2), no report filed, maximum ten thousand (\$10,000) civil penalty. Mr. Hughes has had no previous matters before the board.

On motion by Ott, seconded by McNeece, the board voted unanimously to issue a show cause notice.

Gail Mathes, for failure to timely file a 2006 1st quarter campaign financial disclosure report. Class one (1), six days late, maximum one hundred fifty (\$150) civil penalty. Ms. Mathes has had no previous matters before the board.

On motion by Ott, seconded by McNeece, the board voted unanimously to issue a show cause notice.

Joe Towns, Jr., for failure to timely file a 2006 1st quarter campaign financial disclosure report. Class one (1), three days late, maximum seventy-five (\$75) civil penalty. Rep. Towns has had previous matters before the board.

On motion by Ott, seconded by McNeece, the board voted unanimously to issue a show cause notice.

McMinn County Republican Party, for failure to file a 2006 1st quarter campaign financial disclosure report. Class two (2), no report filed, maximum ten thousand (\$10,000) civil penalty. The organization has had no previous matters before the board.

On motion by Ott, seconded by McNeece, the board voted unanimously to issue a show cause notice.

Pete Drew, for failure to timely file a 2006 Statement of Interests. Class one (1), one day late, maximum twenty-five (\$25) civil penalty. Mr. Drew has had no previous matters before the board.

On motion by Dunavant, seconded by McNeece, the board voted unanimously to take no action in this matter.

Jesse Jobe, for failure to timely file a 2006 Statement of Interests. Class one (1), one day late, maximum twenty-five (\$25) civil penalty. Mr. Jobe has had no previous matters before the board.

On motion by Dunavant, seconded by McNeece, the board voted unanimously to take no action in this matter.

Kevin Smith, for failure to timely file a 2006 Statement of Interests. Class one (1), 10 days late, maximum two hundred fifty (\$250) civil penalty. Mr. Smith has had no previous matters before the board.

On motion by Ott, seconded by McNeece, the board voted unanimously to issue a show cause notice.

Sworn Complaint against Kevin Brooks, Greg Cain and Garry Moore

Director Rawlins provided the board with a sworn complaint filed by Michael Willis, a candidate for House of Representatives in District 24. In his statement, Mr. Willis alleges that Kevin Brooks, Greg Cain and Garry Moore, who are also candidates for House of Representatives in District 24, failed to file Appointment of Political Treasurer forms and 1st quarter campaign financial disclosure reports with the Registry.

Director Rawlins informed the board that the Registry could not issue a show cause notice against the candidates for failure to file 1st quarter campaign financial disclosure reports because they were not sent notices to file the report by the Registry. The notices were not sent because the candidates had not filed Appointment of Treasurer statements with the Registry. Director Rawlins further informed the board that the only action that could be taken would be for the board to issue a show cause notice for the candidates' failure to file Appointment of Political Treasurer statements.

Director Rawlins stated that the candidates had filed their information with the Bradley County Election Commission with the understanding that the commission would forward the information to the Registry and that all candidates had now filed Appointment of Treasurer statements and 1st quarter reports with the Registry.

After discussion, on motion by McClarty, seconded by Dunavant, the board voted unanimously to take no action in this matter.

Reported Financial Expenses

Director Rawlins provided the board members with a list of civil penalties that have been paid year to date.

Director Rawlins presented the expenditure reports for the 2005/2006 fiscal year through April 30, 2006.

Executive Director's Report

Director Rawlins provided the board with a list of campaign finance restrictions placed on members of the Registry.

Director Rawlins informed the board that he had testified in the trial of former Senator Roscoe Dixon in Memphis.

Other Business

Ott, seconded by McNeece made a motion, to adjourn the meeting until the next regularly scheduled meeting. The motion passed unanimously.
