Subject to the General Provisions, the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency offers for sale the timber described as follows:

SCHEDULE OF TIMBER TO BE SOLD

The Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency is offering for sale some timber on Mount Roosevelt Wildlife Management Area. The sale includes the tracts shown on the attached map.

The timber is being sold on a lump sum basis. The timber is located in three tracts near Airport Road in Rockwood, Tennessee

Tract Boundary Descriptions:

Three tracts will be harvested via clear cut with reserves method. All boundaries are marked by blue paint. All shortleaf of any size on any tract are to be left. All stems greater than 2 inches in diameter must be severed from the stump. Reserve trees will be retained at a goal of 4-5 mast producing trees per acre.

The following volume estimates of the timber to be harvested are provided for informational purposes only. The Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency does not guarantee the accuracy of this information in whole or in part.

Unit 1 (Stand 7608) is located off Airport Road between the Rockwood Airport and Lower Road. It is surrounded on two sides by blue paint. Four to Five reserve trees per acre consisting of Oak and Hickory species over 12 inches diameter should be left and all other trees two inches in diameter and larger should be removed (harvested) or felled.

Unit 2 (Stand 7621) is accessed from Lower Road approximately 0.5 miles north of Dry Hill Road. It is surrounded on two sides by blue paint. Four to Five reserve trees per acre consisting of Oak and Hickory species over 12 inches diameter should be left and all other trees two inches in diameter and larger should be removed (harvested) or felled.

Unit 3 (Stand 7624 and 7625) is accessed from Lower Road approximately 1 mile north of Dry Hill Road. It is surrounded on two sides by blue paint. Four to Five reserve trees per acre consisting of Oak and Hickory species over 12 inches diameter should be left and all other trees two inches in diameter and larger should be removed (harvested) or felled.
