





Another member steps in to resource & case manage when a member has a need for or can no longer assist a Veteran client because of scope of service.



In the past year, zip code 37042 had the highest amount of compensation NATIONWIDE!

Since establishing the Coalition, VA home loans in our area have increased by 115%.

Increase in unique Veteran visits to our Clarksville clinic by 23%, with an additional 8,749 Veterans sent to community care between 2020-2022.

These increases are due in part to our local county Veteran Service **Organization filing** 27,490 claims in a 3-year period.
