Highlights

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2023 County Population Estimates

The Census Bureau's Population Estimates Program (PEP) produces estimates of the population for the United States, its states, counties, cities, and towns, as well as for the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico. Demographic components of population change (births, deaths, and migration) are produced at the national, state, and county levels.

PEP annually utilizes current data on births, deaths, and migration to calculate population change since the most recent decennial census and produce a time series of estimates of population, demographic components of change, and housing units. The annual time series of estimates begins with the most recent decennial census data and extends to the vintage year.

Statewide, Tennessee saw an estimated population increase of 1.1 percent or 77,513 residents between July 1, 2022 and July 1, 2023 to 7,126,489 residents. Domestic migration accounted for the largest share of the increase as 63,417 people moved to Tennessee from elsewhere in the United States.

Tennessee's five most populous counties are Shelby, Davidson, Knox, Hamilton, and Rutherford. In these counties reside 2,870,010 residents, just over 40% of Tennessee's population. The next largest 31 counties contain approximately the same number of residents leaving the 59 smallest counties with just over 18 percent of the state's population.

Population declined in only five of Tennessee's 95 counties. Shelby County lost 6,513 residents, or 0.7% of its population. Lake County lost 153 residents,

which represented the largest proportional loss at 2.4 percent. Lauderdale, Haywood, and Wayne were the only other counties to lose population.

Tennessee's least populous counties were Pickett, Lake, Van Buren, Moore, and Hancock. These counties were home to just under one half of one percent of the state's population. Of these five counties, all but Lake experienced population growth from 2022 to 2023.

Loudon County had the highest population growth rate at 4.0%, while Rutherford's population increased the most in absolute terms at 6,419 residents, or 1.8%. Marshall, Meigs and Wilson were the only other counties with growth rates higher than 3%.

Only 13 counties experienced a natural increase in population where births exceeded deaths. The natural increase in these counties was still enough to drive a statewide natural increase of 1,028 residents. The counties with the largest natural increases were Davidson (4,390) Shelby (3,030), Montgomery (1,979) and Rutherford (1,708).

Haywood, Lake, Lauderdale, Shelby, and Wayne were the only counties to see negative net migration, Shelby County lost 11,683 residents to domestic migration. Davidson County also lost 3,581 residents to domestic migration, though this was more than offset by adding 4,293 residents through international migration.

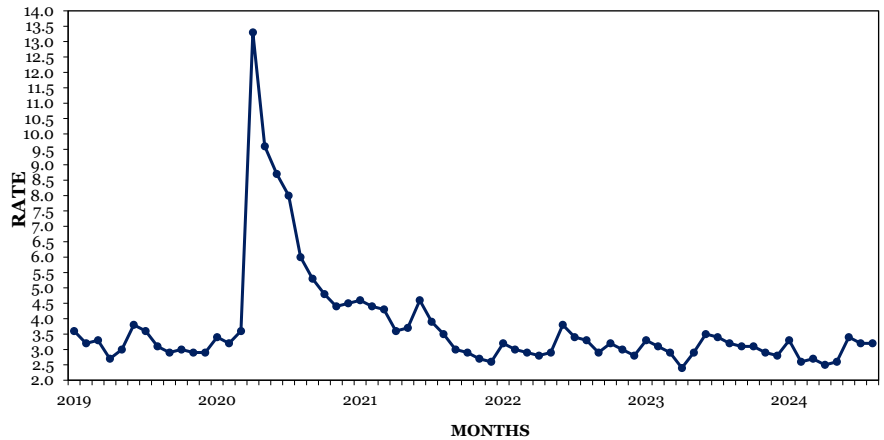

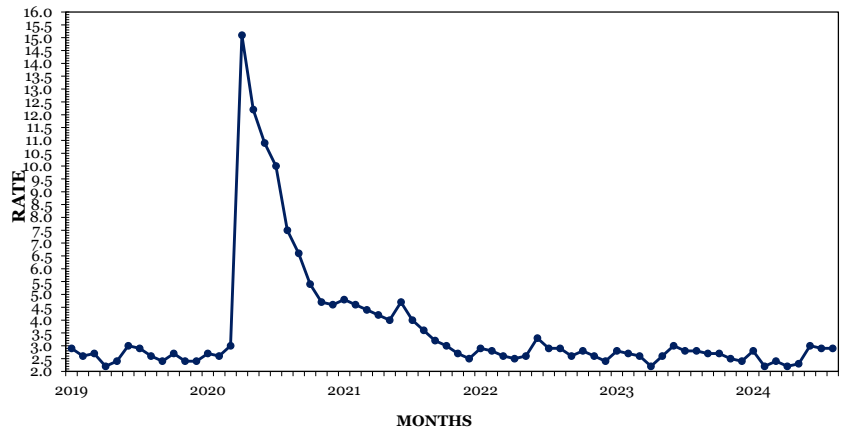
